

Remarks of the Weather Jan. 1885

- Sun. Monday 26 - fresh winds from N and N first part of the morning. Clouds a light fall of snow in the night at 10 A.M. it came out sunny and clear at sundown Wind N.N.W. Glass 32 but clear Eth's sick had the doctor twice
- Tuesday 27 - wind N.N.W. clear and cold Glass 10° to 16° above Eth's. Since better at 10 A.M. the doctor came down a few times a stiring Capt. N. Norton brought a ~~fish~~ on shore
- Wednesday 28 - light wind S.E. and S.E. rain in torrents some thunder lightning at noon wind shifted to N. Gales 48 at 1 P.M. at sundown Glass 8° above in the afternoon wind N.W. snow and cold at 9 P.M. Glass 7° above Gales from N.N.W. Eth's some better this evening
- Thursday 29 - Gales from N and cold but clear weather Glass 4° to 14° above Aunt Rhoda came down on her way to Mattapoisett
- Friday 30 - light wind N and S.E. fine weather Glass 14° to 30° Brother Arrive and Aunt Rhoda went to Mattapoisett to day Eth's improving slowly Fannie took to her room
- Saturday 31 - light wind N.N.W. and very fine winter weather Glass 24° to 32° Eth's improving Fannie still in her room
- Sunday Feb 1 - light wind with rain and snow from S.E. Glass 36° Eth's still improving Fannie in her room sulking
- Monday 2 - Gales from N and cold Glass 10° to 14° and clear weather same Ice Fannie has got over her sulking Eth's is better
- Tuesday 3 - light wind N.N.W. and cold Glass 7° to 14° pleasant beautiful weather
- Wednesday 4 - light wind N.N.W. & N quite cold Glass 10° to 20° a few passing vessels some Ice in the Sound
- Thursday 5 - fine winter weather wind N Glass 18° to 32° plenty of Ice
- Friday 6 - strong wind N and N.E. light fine snow Glass 28° to 20° at sundown quite a snow storm
- Saturday 7 - fresh wind from N.N.W. clear and cold plenty of Ice Glass 10° to 25° Peter came home to day
- Sunday 8 - light Gales N.N.W. & N plenty of Ice the Nantuxet Boat came up last night and went home to day Glass 12° to 24°
- Monday 9 - light wind N and fine weather plenty of Ice The Steamer did not go out to Mass. Hall to day and returned with the mail & stores coming in from S.E.

Remarks on the weather continued Feb. 1885

- Tuesday 10 - heavy falls of rain through the night with Gales from E.S.E. to S.E. at daylight moderated with fog and light rain wind the same
- Wednesday 11 - Gales from N.W. and clear and cold Glass 7° to 12° some Ice a few vessels moving
- Thursday 12 - strong winds to the North N.W. and steady cold Glass 12° to 16° plenty of Ice floating around
- Friday 13 - in the fore noon light air and calm plenty of Ice Capt. Gorus left his home for Hualulu in the afternoon the wind breezed up from N.E. in the evening commenced snowing
- Saturday 14 - light wind from the North about 3 in. of snow on the ground at 3 P.M. Mrs. Moss came home sick at 6 P.M. came in snow and wind N.E.
- Sunday 15 - fresh wind N and N.N.W. the harbor most full of Ice Glass 20° to 29° largest fall of snow the winter the sun out bright some part of the day
- Monday 16 - light gales and fresh Gales this day from N.E. to S.E. with light snow in the morning and plenty of rain the rest of the day the harbor full of Ice a number of vessels ashore to the Eastward went on shore in the Ice at 8 P.M. had a very heavy squall and shift of wind and rain in torrents
- Tuesday 17 - fresh wind from N.N.W. to N.W. Glass 20° to 10° the Ice most all out of sight the Steam Boat came from New Bedford the first time for 11 days
- Wednesday 18 - light wind from E to S.E. some snow and cold Glass 14° to 16° and cloudy weather a number of vessels in the harbor the Boston cutter and New Port cutter in port in the afternoon the Dexter towed in a Fisherman loaded with Fish bound to New York
- Thursday 19 - light wind from North and West wind plenty of Ice but pleasant Glass 10° to 20° above zero
- Friday 20 - light wind N.N.W. to N.W. fine weather but cold Glass 10° to 20° above the most of the vessels froze in the river going from New York on Ice the Steamer came from N.Y.
- Saturday 21 - light wind N.N.E. and N.N.W. plenty of Ice and quite cold Glass 14° to 24° above zero
- Sunday 22 - the same continued
- Monday 23 - the same weather continued plenty of Ice
- Tuesday 24 - wind N.N.W. and light N.N.W. Glass 16° to 28° at sundown threatening a storm plenty of Ice
