Sunday 34 light winds from a fine snow most all day at 3 P.M. the Regis came in Port with three vessels employing 14 men and two vessels Class 11% above

Monday 35 fresh winds E. & S. and cloudy over cast and snow-hall and rain very unpleasant weather at sundown came in a snow storm and rain storm. B. Norton sent up for 9 months for stealing a check of Marine Bank

Tuesday 36 light winds E. & S. to E. & S. foggy and rain at 3 P.M. the sun came out and it was quite warm and pleasant Chas. B. Norton came home at sundown came in thick fog

Wednesday 37 light winds East and S. E. some fog at dark rain unpleasant Mr. Thos. Killman Tied and a young girl took poison and killed her self up to Sam. Look Farm at evening heavy rain

Thursday 38 light winds N.E. to East plenty of rain all day long at dark wind North some rain had a letter from Peter born to Mr. Rogers in a letter

Friday 39 light winds from the East some rain and mild weather rain most of the time very unpleasant

Saturday 40 mild weather variable winds rain and sunshin a few fairs a morning So. Lumber Ship

Sunday 41 rains N. N. W. to N. E. Class 33% to 33% above all of the fairs left the Harbor a pleasant day at sundown light winds E. & some cloudy Harter and Lucia called

Monday Feb. 1. light gales N. W. and a little cold clear weather Sunday 2 fresh winds to the North and West rain and cold Class 14% to 25% above clear weather Capt. Norton has a Pilot berth in a Bk. for Boston

Tuesday 3 fresh winds N. N. W. and cold Class 15% to 23% Capt. D. N. Claghorn left the Delana for San Francisco So. Lumber has a Pilot berth in a Bk. for Boston at sundown came in snow rain N. E.

Wednesday 4 Calm from N. E. and the heaviest snow storm of the season Class 20% at sundown snowing still some deep drifts wind N. N. E. Class 10% above at 9 P.M. rain N. N. E. Class 5% above high winds and stars out think the snow storm over

Friday 5 fresh gales N. W. and cold at sunrise 3% below at 1 P.M. 5% above at sundown 3% above at 10 P.M. 7% clear weather some ice the most snow of season

Saturday 6 clear and pleasant and cold Class 7% in the morning at 7 A.M. and at noon 10% above at sun down 14% above at 9 P.M. 14% above calm light flurry of snow the weather looking East by the Red Sea cutter employed in breaking up the ice in the Harbor and towing out six vessels in the Harbor the steamer went out to Woods Hole to day and brought the mails

Sunday 7 light winds from N. and calm some of the ice in the Harbor Class from 16% to 26% above

Monday 8 light winds from N. to N. W. and fine weather at 2 P.M. Pilot Heron Lumber came in the Harbor from the Metrona having been gone some 9 days bound for Boston in a Bk. cotton loaded a few fairs started for Boston but the most still lay in Port weather mild

Tuesday 9 light N. W. winds and mild weather all of the fairs left bound East the Bk. took a tow boat this time

Wednesday 10 light air and calm and mild weather a few fairs in Port

Thursday 11 fresh winds N. E. with fog and rain at sundown light gales N. E. and rain the snow is going fast unpleasant weather Class 34% above

Friday 12 light winds from N. E. to E. and rain and fog

Saturday 13 variable winds and rain and fog mild weather but very unpleasant and very warm

Sunday 14 fine beautiful weather wind N. W. 3 Pilot Berth's Capt. L. M. Smith So. Lumber William B. Claghorn

Monday 15 in the morning beautiful weather at 10 A.M. light wind S. E. at noon wind N. W. and smoky weather at sundown fresh gales and weather looking bad at 9 P.M. heavy gales N. W. with squalls of rain and rain
