

Brig Ocean of Sandwich on a

Friday, March 12th
 Begins with light winds from the E & S and
 squally with some rain. Saw a sail to the
 S. E. Steered W by N at 4 PM. Calm & heavy
 swell bearing from the W. E. side of point.
 Squally at 5 PM fine breeze from the S. E.
 made all sail and steered W by N at 6 PM. At
 West End of Mona North. Saw at 8 PM.
 Bunch through the passage Ends with
 fine weather. St. Domingo in sight.

Saturday, March 13th
 Begins with fresh breezes from the W. E.
 Steered W by N at 7 PM. Monai Bone of the
 at Sandogon, the weather looking bad.
 and squally. Took in the courses and close
 reefed the top. Sailed at 11 PM. A small
 part squally with lightning at 8 PM. The weather
 looking squally. Set the fore sail and
 by 10 PM and steered in for the land. At 11 PM
 at a meridian point Salines Bone W by N at
 5 leagues.

Sunday, March 14th
 Begins with strong trades from the N.
 with thick heavy looking weather.
 took in the fore sail and took shells
 out the fore hatch at 4 PM. More moderate
 part here off and steered W by N at 5 PM.
 here we heading to the South with part
 heavy gale from the East and squally with light
 at 8 PM. More ship and headed in for the land
 and set the fore sail. Sub close reefed at 8 PM.
 the land. Steered West at 10 PM. Ready point
 in sight. Bearing W by N at 11 PM. Meridian Run
 in between Beaty and Chavala.

Monday, March 15th
 Begins with strong gales from the E & S and
 thick heavy weather at 5 PM. Came to anchor
 in Peter Cove found lying there. A powder
 box of 100 lbs. powder and a box of powder.
 Given of oranges, figs, pine of several middle
 part moderate latter with some breeze and fine
 weather. Employed painting the boat.

Tuesday, March 16th
 Begins with strong breezes from the East and fine
 weather. Employed fitting new fast ropes and
 making a new necessary. Repair middle part
 moderate at day light got under way in E.
 with the Brig. Steered to Cruise in the bay
 at a meridian of the Chalk light a sail
 in sight to the leeward.

Wednesday, March 17th
 Begins with strong trades and fine weather heading
 on the wind to the South at 10 AM. Took in for the
 land at 1 PM. Took in sail and headed off shore
 middle part moderate at day light made
 all sail and steered in. Saw a sail to the
 Westward heading in for the land at 1 PM. with
 moderate gales and fine weather.

Thursday, March 18th
 Begins with moderate gales and fine weather
 Steered in sight. Bearing ESE middle part
 light air and calm. latter much the same.
 Saw two fish. Spoke the from 5 men
 Dick.

Friday, March 19th
 Begins with light trades and fine weather.
 Spoke the ship union 3 or 4 miles off.
 PM. Saw Blackfish. Landed got four
 middle and latter part. Cabin.

Saturday, March 20th
 all these 21 hours light air and calm.
 Saw Blackfish. Landed got nothing.

Sunday, March 21st
 Begins with light air from the S. E. and
 fine weather. one Brig and a Barque in
 sight. middle and latter part much the
 same.

Monday, March 22nd
 all this day light air from the South
 and calm.
