Tuesday March 23rd
 Begins with light airs and Calms Several
 Sails in Sight to the East

Wednesday March 24th
 all this day light airs and Calms Saw
 Blackfish towed get her

Thursday March 25th
 all this day light airs from the S.W. and
 fine weather. Toward the Blackfish at
 4 PM. Came to anchor of the morning latter
 part employed getting of water and painting

Friday March 26th
 Begins Calm. Employed painting and getting
 off water. middle part light winds of the land
 at day light got under way and stood
 out. Ends with light winds from the South
 and fine weather saw porpoises

Saturday March 27th
 Begins with moderate gales from the East
 & West and fine weather. Several Sails in
 Sight to the Eastward at 5 PM sent a Boat
 with letters on Board the Sth Union middle
 part strong breezes from the East at 8 AM
 spoke the Sth America of New Bedford 8 miles
 out 10 hrs at 10. Saw Blackfish towed get
 three steers to the South & West

Sunday March 28th
 Begins with light winds from the North & West
 Heavy S.W. middle part squally at 4 PM
 Steer West over sail in sight at about 10 miles
 West Ends with moderate gales from the North
 East and Rain

Monday March 29th
 Begins with strong trades and squally mid
 part much the same latter fine weather
 Looked out the Blackfish Cape Cod over
 Light

Tuesday March 31st
 all this day light winds from the East at
 heavy swell heaving from the N.E.
 Steer W.S.W. Lat 40 18 54 Long 75 05

Wednesday March 31st
 Begins with moderate trade Steer W.S.W.
 Direct Steer Steer E & W about the
 fore top of sail to fore repairs at 5 PM
 sent a middle part fine weather at day light
 Saw the Isle of Jamaica at 9 AM. yachts
 point home with dist 5 leagues Ends with
 fine weather

Thursday April 1st
 Begins with moderate gales from the S.E.
 and fine weather at 5 PM Portland sighted being
 N.E. dist 5 miles at 12 PM. Luffee too to the
 South and lay with the main top sail aback
 at day light put of made all sail and run
 into New Bedford Bay. Saw four square rigged
 ships to anchor

Friday April 2nd
 Begins with strong breezes from the S.E. and
 fine weather. Hove up the yards & luffed on the
 wind to the South saw 10 ships. Began up
 for Blue field Bay at 4 PM. Strong breezes
 squared the yards and Steer W.S.W. middle
 part fine weather latter much the same about
 the new ship and sent the old one

Saturday April 3rd
 Begins with moderate gales from the E.N.E.
 and fine weather at 10 PM made ground
 Cayman middle of it. Steer N.W. dist 5 miles
 at 8 sent a Boat in and got of some
 Rum

Sunday April 4th
 all this day moderate gales from the East
 and fine weather at Sun down left the Island
 Steer N.W. Lat 40 19 33 Long 82 35
 Luffe luffe
