Sunday July 4th
 Begins with strong breezes from the North & East and passing clouds headed by South under all sail one sail in sight to the South heading to the South & East at Sun set took in the light sails and furled the main sail three sails in sight middle part light variable from the East and fine weather headed S.E. at 3 AM tacked ship to the North & East one sail in sight to the South West heading to the N.E. Ends with light air and fine weather
 Lat 35 02 Long 46 38

Monday July 5th
 Begins with light air from the East inclining Southwards headed to the North & East two sails in sight Breeze Eastwards at Sun set the sails in light middle part light air from the South and fine weather headed S.E. at day light made all sail Steered East two sails in sight Breeze Eastwards at 2 Saw Blackfish launched for nothing but with fine breeze from the South and a heavy swell hearing from the N.W.

Tuesday July 6th
 Begins with fine breezes from the South and at 3 PM saw Blackfish launched got nothing Saw some bitter Squid at 3 launched again for Blackfish but nothing at sunset. Weathered sail headed to the South and West at 1 PM was ship to the South & East at 9 PM tacked to the West Ends with strong breezes from the South West and fine weather Saw great quantities of fish made and several large pieces of Squid
 Lat 35 15 Long 45 30

Wednesday July 7th
 Begins with strong breezes from the N.W. and passing clouds at 2 PM tacked ship to the South and East one sail in sight headed to the North and East at 3 PM took in sail double Reefed the top sail furled main sail & middle part Squally with rain latter part strong breezes from N.W. made all sail off N.E. saw Bitter Squid at 11 Steered East
 Lat 35 15 Long 45 00

Bound Eastward 1832

Thursday July 8th
 Begins with strong breezes from N.W. and Squally Steered East at Sun set double Reefed the top sail took in main sail and furled middle part strong breezes from the South West and Squally with rain headed S.E. at day light weathered latter part strong gales from the S.W. and heavy squalls took in and made sail as occasion required
 Lat 35 21 Long 42 25

Friday July 9th
 Begins with strong gales from the South West and Squally Steered E. under double Reefed top sails middle part strong breezes from the S.W. and passing clouds at day light made sail set double top sails and main top 1/2 sail at 6 AM Squally at 11 PM of heavy rain from points of the lee bow going to windward like a Breeze came two boats could not get in to head of them the third Breeze was out of sight to the windward one sail in sight of the weather became Ends with strong breezes from the S.W. and passing clouds Steered East
 Lat 36 32 Long 39 45

Saturday July 10th
 Begins with strong breezes from the South & West and passing clouds Steered East at 4 PM Saw porpoise the Watch employed putting New fast ropes to the masts and making some repairs on the rigging at sunset took in the light sails and double Reefed the top sail and hauled on its wind to the South & East at day light made all sail Steered S.W. latter part more moderate Saw nothing got up a superscription among all hand of fifty eight dollars for the one that saved the hundred Bitter whale if got by the Brig

Sunday July 11th
 Begins with strong breezes from the West and Squally weather Steered N.E. at sunset took in top 1/2 sail 1/2 top & courses and double Reefed the top sail hauled on the wind to the N.W. West middle part Cloudy latter part Squally with sail headed N.W. West
 Lat 32 23 Long 33 42
