

At the Azores 1832

Sunday Sept 5th

Begins with strong breezes from the West. Evening in between St. George and Graziat. Three Barges in sight at 7 finished the fore sail and bent it middle part strong gale from the N.W. inclining Northerly heading to the N.E. between Graziat and Tencas at 8 AM were ship to the West at day light strong gale from the North and Squally. Steered for the East end of St. George one Barge in sight Steering the same course

Monday Sept 6th

Begins with light Baffling winds and Calms lagging to night. Short sail under the East end of St. George one Barge in sight Steering in between Tencas and St. George middle part strong breezes from the East and Squally took in the fore top sail latter part more moderate made up sail. Steered in fore evening two Barges one Barge in sight Ends with Squally weather ready in fore evening

Tuesday Sept 7th

Begins with strong breezes from the South and Squally headed E.S. Saw a storm petrel. Dug the fore top sail hanging to her side Steering E.S. at 4 double reefed the fore top sail middle part strong breezes from the S.E. and fine weather Steered E.S. took part of strong breezes from the S.E. and clear turned out the Reefs and let the main sail saw grampuses Employed lifting up the main & main top mast stays. Lat 35 20 Long 25 20

Wednesday Sept 8th

All this day strong breezes from the South inclining West. Steered on the wind to the South & East saw porpoises at 4 P.M. took in sail middle part. P.M. saw and lightning at day light made up sail. Lat 35 47 Long 25 36

S.E. From St. Michael 1832

Thursday Sept 9th

All this day light winds from the N.E. and fine weather headed South by compass at 8. Steered South by day light made up sail. St. Michael in sight saw grampuses and porpoises and Black fish. To windward made several tackes but saw nothing more. Lat 35 10 Long 25 15

Friday Sept 10th

Commences with light winds from the N.E. and fine weather. At 7 AM saw something we called upon four miles to the windward lowered the sails pulled up byt saw nothing more one Barge in sight Steering E.S. at 4 took in sail middle part light winds from the West headed E.S. at day light made up sail. Saw four jacks at 11 took in squall from the West took in the light sails. Lat 35 30 Long 22 15

Saturday Sept 11th

Begins with light airs from the West and P.M. clouds under the piping jills to spare. Repairs to finished & bent it and sported sail middle part fine rain at day light lugged out the Reefs two sails in sight Steering East. Lat 35 16 Long 22 20

Sunday Sept 12th

Begins with light winds from the West inclining Northerly at 7 AM. home to heading West under short sail middle part. Squally with rain latter part fine breezes from the N.W. and P.M. clouds. Lat 35 40 Long

Monday Sept 13th

Begins with fine breezes from the N.E. and P.M. squally with rain headed by N.W. made part much the same at day light made sail Steered by day light. Reefs sawered the boat but could not overtake them Ends with light airs from the N.E. and fine weather. Capt. John Jack & land Report. Beginning the next. Lat 35 00 Long
