A. B. back to the windward towards E. B. vent
hauled up anchor Beat to considerance

Begin, with fine Breezes from the East
and Smoky Sprawl 15 ft. to the West of
A. Ventura at Sunset took in the light. It is
middle part. Strong Breeze from the East
increasing. Sounding at 2nd the stacked to the
top. Sounding in light at 10. Sounded to
the East. Ends with Strong Breezes from the
S.E. and Clear & heavy at night. Heavy
from the W.N.

Thursday Dec 19th

Thursday Dec 19 1890
Begin with shooting Pronges from the P.E.
and Clear Steam East - Tow Lancaster at 10.00
Set Clear Keel the top sails took in main
sail by fail and jib at day light strong
Pronges from the South headed E.S. at 10
with four or five any several groups
to coincide. Supposed them to be American
whale. Ends with heavy gale from the
South and thick weather. Pronges Ben
East during night

Monday Dec 20th

Begins more moderate, wear ship to the N. W.
and set main sail, jib and try sail at sun
set took in sail and headed off more inside
port. Strung Buoys from the Mast with Squalls
a fair took in the fore sail and close reefed
the main top sail at 8 AM turned out the Reef
and set the Courses End with fresh Buoys
from the Mast and passing Clewds one sail
the light to the windward

Wednesday Dec 21

Tuesday Dec 11
 Begins with fresh Breeze from the Westward
 passing Clouds Steered N N W Saw five or six
 Spouting and Breaching at Sunset Clouds
 Kept the top sails middle part moderate wind
 inclining Westward wore ship at daylight made all
 sail and steered E N E A heavy Squall bearing
 from the N W Lat 01 30 03 Long 14 08 West

Wednesday, Dec 22nd

Wednesday, June 22
Begins with moderate gale from the S W and fine
weather. Steved E & P under all sail at 5 1/2 PM. Saw
Blackfish toward two boats got nothing, middle part
windy inclining Eastward, and fine weather headed
E & P under short sail at day light made sail
windy E & P headed S E Saw Linback's Schooner
this day
Lat obs 29 53 Long 12 53

Thursday Dec 23rd

Begins with strong breezes from the W &
 and fairing strongly headed E by S at 3 PM
 tack into the N W and back in the main top
 gaffers sail. Saw finback at sunset. Strong
 breezes from E N E and squally day headed
 to the North under close reefed main top sail
 and fore top mast stay sail at day light
 tacked to the under the top sail and fore sail
 and with strong breezes from the N W
 and a heavy dew morning land in sight
