Friday Dec 24th

Friday Dec 19th
Begins with strong breezes from E &
and rising clouds heading in for N.
Clear 4-5 PM Spoke the Columbia close in
with Lancaster saw a Barque to the West
Bygone, up middle part lay in when sheet
sail the wind strong from the East at
day light made sail heading NNE the
cypreiss and Barque in sight End with
fine weather

Saturday Dec 25th 1857

Begins with fine breeze and pleasant
 trading in for 15 Canoes. A Ch. canoe
 in sight off our lee at sunset took in fast
 in company with the canoe. Saw a Barque
 to the South West, made her light seven miles from
 the East. Made to the North East in with the
 land at day light made sail Barque and 1/2
 in light wind light from the East saw finches
 a Laganza East dist. 10 miles

Sunday Dec 2. 18

Sunday Dec 2th
Begins with light air from the south, an
East and calm. Spent the forenoon with the
latter part much the same. Saw penback
and Porpoise.

Monday, Dec 27

Monday Dec 21.
Begins with moderate gale from the East and
fine weather at 4 PM. Hope the Boigne Circle
Capt. Rajah, fifty days from middle port
much they bring latter part light airs and
calms. Saw a Boonah to the Westward and a
in sight heading in for the land.

Monday Dec 28th

Thursday Dec 28th.
Begins with light air from the East and fine
weather at 4 the wind shifted to the W. by 5. Saw
Spring Lake at 6. Spent the forenoon hunting and
stood in but saw nothing more at 4 P.M. Calm
midnight. Calm at day light light breeze from
S. inclining South West. Steved 12 packages
Left Running along the land to the South
at 10. Ends with light air and Calm. Lake below
Bore East dist 6 leagues

Wednesday Dec 29

Wednesday Dec 27
Begins with light variable wind and Calm
America in sight in Shore at 4 PM Calm Grand
Cape Horn Is. disappears in Night at 5 PM light air from
the North and East - reached St. J. 11/2 under the
fore and main top sail at day light Strong breeze
from the South & East Palma Rown in sight
Beginning West dist 5 leagues Saw 4 fore and aft
with fine Breezes from the South and Pleasant
Palma Bore N by W dist 5 leagues

Thursday Dec 30th

Thursday The 21st
Commenced with moderate breeze from the
South and shifted off by S. by E. gales
at 5 PM came to anchor in thirteen fathoms of
water, midnight light vis from the West side
Cape, these Remarks Ends at 11 PM and contains
but 10 hours to Commerce Harbor account

Thursday Dec 30th

Thursday Dec 30th
 Began with light air from the West by breeze
 then heaving in at 5 AM attempted to land
 a boat but could not the surf breaking
 nearly high at 2 PM. Then breeze from the
 North started the sheet anchor let go the
 second and brought her up later found more
 moderate with heavy rain

Freitag Dec 31 ¹⁸⁶¹

First part moderate, at 9 AM only watch went down on liberty line up the second anchor midle part strong. Buoys from the water and equally with being got off some water at 4 PM sighted the first anchor and paid out fifty fathoms of chain at sund all hands came off but one at 2 strong breeze from off the land at 4 PM the wind talled to the N E at 5 PM strong Breeze from the N E with lightning and a heavy such raining on shore called all hands and got ready for getting under way Buoys the cable and got ready to slip in case the Starbel der anchor
