

Brig Ocean of Sandwich

Saturday Jan 1st

Begins with strong breezes from N.E. the
Brig picking up a few feet of rain in morning
more moderate with a heavy squall. Breeze
later part more moderate with rain the
wind inclining Northerly

Sunday Jan 2nd

Begins with strong breezes from N.W. and
heavy rain at 11. Period of fine breezes from
the North and passing clouds of heavy
squalls. Breeze at the anchorage place at 1 P.M.
the strongest watch went on. Some landed
on the beach to the North of the town
at night all the men came off but a midshipman
fresh breezes from the North

Monday Jan 3rd

Begins with fresh breezes from the N.E. with
passing clouds at 9 A.M. landed a boat on the
beach North of the town is breaking heavy
Cayal not lost at the pier employed Tanding
Ship at 9 A.M. the character of Sandwich is
come in to anchor End with fine weather

Tuesday Jan 4th

Begins with fresh breezes from the N.E.
at day light a large Spanish Steamer came
in employed getting off recruits and Private
End with moderate breezes from the North
& East and fine weather

Wednesday Jan 5th

Begins with light breeze from the N.E. at day light
passing clouds at day light cloudy with light
squalls of rain, get under way and steering
out to sea then remarks Commerce ship
seen and early when minute and continue but
in hours to Commerce ship absent

Cruising Between Canary & St. Vincent

Thursday Jan 6th

Begins with light winds from N.E. at 2 A.M.
at 5 P.M. Steamer Sail at day light made
all sail and steered to the North & East at 11
P.M. mentioned Bore North about 4 leagues

Friday Jan 7th

All the day fresh breezes from the N.E. and
passing clouds Steamer 3 to the N.E. saw one
Whale

Saturday Jan 8th

Begins with moderate gales from the North &
passing clouds Steamer N.W. at 2 P.M.
Sail up the Bore top of the mast at 11
at 11 P.M. the top sail later part
moderate gales from the N.E. and clouds
made all sail tacked ship and steered to
the East

Sunday Jan 9th

Begins with fine breezes from N.E. & cloudy
evening in between the Island Canary and
St. Vincent at 6 P.M. fresh breezes from the N.E.
steamed up in to Palmas tacked off and back
in sail with the Port fine breezes and passing
clouds at day light made all sail and
steered in for the harbor something of the
American tacks and steamed one for venturing
End with fine breezes and fine weather

Monday Jan 10th

Begins with fine breezes from N.E. with passing
clouds Steamer 10 miles all sail at 11
P.M. fresh breeze in the night sails at 2 P.M.
tacked to the North with fine weather
and cloudy at 4 P.M. tacked to the East and
End with strong breezes and cloudy

Tuesday Jan 11th

All the day fresh breezes from N.E. and
cloudy steering to the North and East
