

# In the Mar. Pequeno Sea 1833

Monday Sept 3<sup>rd</sup>

Begins with fine breezes from the N.W. and pleasant breeze in few clouds at 4 Commences hoisting at 6 top in sail tacked and headed off shore middle part fine with latter part cloudy. Steered along shore to the S.W. at 10 finished hoisting.

Tuesday Sept 4<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate gale from N.W. and cloudy. Steering along shore to the S.W. at sunset shortened sail headed N.W. at 10 m. way. Ship headed E. at 11 m. got cloudy. Steered along shore to the S.W. showed down the oil at 11 m. saw white water off the water beam sailed up and made all sail. Ends with fine weather.

Wednesday Sept 5<sup>th</sup>

All this day light winds from the North and cloudy. Rain. Bowed the S.W. at 10 m. got in sail at day light made all sail steered on the wind to the N.W. at 10 m. got in sail. Point Jacamar Bore N.W. at 11 m. 3 leagues.

Thursday Sept 6<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from the E. headed S.W. the water employed. Sailing up the main rigging at 10 m. took in sail. headed E. at 11 m. tacked and headed in for the land the wind light from the North. Some grasses and porpoises. The water employed. Sailing up the main top mast rigging at 10 m. Kept the top sail & headed off shore at 11 m. tacked and headed in for the land. latter part calm. The jackman Bore N.W. at 11 m. 10 miles.

Friday Sept 7<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light baffling winds and calm. middle and latter part much the same. Saw porpoises and grasses on sail. The oil saw the land.

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Saturday Sept 8<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from the N.W. East and calm. one sail in sight heading off shore at 2 PM light breeze from S.E. sails up and lowered got two struck the third but got loose at 5 PM the King Theonix came up and stood passed to windward after the whales at dark look in all sail but closed. Kept main top sail. top mast stay sail middle part. Steered along shore from N.W. and cloudy at day light. Commenced. Parted the fluke chain and tore the rigging to pieces at 10 m. got all in. Saw a large break to windward two sails in sight. one Spanish Schooner. Run down within half a mile and then halted her wind. Ends with moderate gale and fine weather made all sail and headed in for the land.

Sunday Sept 9<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from the North & fine weather. Steered E. along shore. Two sails in sight at 2 PM calm middle part light winds from the North headed E. at day light fine breezes from the North one sail in sight to windward. middle part in sight. The same. The American Coast in sight. Employed Boatswain.

Monday Sept 10<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate gale from the North and fine weather. Employed hoisting at 4 PM tacked ship. Cape Juby in sight off our lee beam. 10 leagues at 5 PM saw two ventures and espies both in sight middle part fine with wind. N.W. headed N.W. at day light. Got main top sail. Got at 10 m. latter part strong breeze and foggy clouds close in with the ventures.

Tuesday Sept 11<sup>th</sup>

All this day strong breezes from the N.W. and foggy clouds at 2 PM double kept the top sails middle part with much the same making ship tacks to windward towards point Jacamar. latter part employed. Steering down the oil saw grasses and porpoises.
