

Mar. Pequeno Sea 1833

Saturday Sept 21st

Begins with fine trade and pleasant employment
boiling at 4 PM made with sail headed off shore
at 4 PM saw sperm whales lowered into boats
got two saw at whaling. It is to the SE
middle part fine weather employed boiling latter
part strong breeze cut in the whale



Sunday Sept 22nd

Begins with moderate trade and fine weather at
4 PM backed off heading ESE under short sail
all hands employed clearing up decks middle
part moderate with a heavy swell turned the
keels out the main top sail latter part strong
trade & a heavy swell leaving from the SE
employed boiling ends with strong trade
close in with the land heading off shore

Monday Sept 23rd

Begins with strong breeze and a heavy sea
put off and run in under the land middle
part the same finished boiling latter part
strong winds and cloudy employed boiling
down the oil close in under the SE end
of the venture

Tuesday Sept 24th

Begins with strong trade and heavy weather
under close reefed top sail close in with the
land showing down oil middle part more
moderate set the courses and stood off at 4 PM
strong breezes took in the courses and stood in
for the land at day light made some sail
and stood off light found it blowing heavy
were ship and stood in for the land

Wednesday Sept 25th

Begins with strong gale from the North and
a heavy sea working up under the lee of the
land split the fore top sail at 4 PM sent it
new main top sail all hands employed Repairing
the old main top sail to be set forward middle
part more moderate a heavy bank in the light
latter part weather much the same finished the top
sail & went at heading in for the land

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Thursday Sept 26th

Begins with strong breezes from the SE and
thick weather saw porpoise on ship in sight putting
up along shore middle and latter part weather much
the same saw porpoises & grampuses

Friday Sept 27th

Begins with strong breezes and fine weather
at 4 PM spoke the schooner Richard of Port
mouton & was at sunset within sail middle
and latter part more moderate made sail turned
up the boat hauled and painted her the Richard
in sight to the windward

Saturday Sept 28th

Begins with moderate trade and thick haze
within the Richard in sight of the weather heavy
middle and latter part much the same heading
in for the land

Sunday Oct 1st

Begins with fine trade and thick weather cut
a paper middle and latter part much the
same spoke the brig Phoenix

Monday Oct 2nd

All this day fine trade and thick haze
within spoke the Phoenix took up Blasted
whale along side at 6 spoke the H. Seal

Tuesday Oct 3rd

Begins with fine trade and cloudy
foggy day light at 4 PM took in top
sails off shore jockamar. Westward two
leagues at 8 PM cut off porpoise middle part
weather much the same at day light made
sail latter part strong trade and cloudy double
reefed the top sail Phoenix in sight of our
weather beam

Wednesday Oct 4th

All this day strong breezes from the SE and
cloudy standing off and on at 5 PM
jockamar on sail in sight to the leeward
heading up saw porpoises and
small breaches
