Wednesday June 7th
all this day light winds from the East and
fine weather saw blackish lowered two
boats got nothing. Lat 32 26 Long 47 41

Thursday June 8th
all this day light winds from the East and
fine weather saw a Brig steering to the North
Lat 31 40 Long 47 51

Friday June 9th
all this day light winds from the East
and fine weather steering to the N.E. East
Lat 32 49 Long 48 00

Saturday June 10th
all this day light winds from the S.E. and pleasant
steered E by Compass one sail in sight
steering the same course Lat 33 49 Long 47 00

Sunday June 11th
all this day light winds from the S.W. and
fine pleasant weather steered East under
short sail saw a Brig to the North steering
the same course Lat 34 26 Long 46 19

Monday June 12th
all this day strong winds from the West
and passing clouds steered E by one sail
in sight steering the same course
Lat 35 40 Long 44 49

Tuesday June 13th
all this day strong breezes from the West and
strong squally steered E by one sail
to the North saw plenty finbacks
Lat 36 33 Long 42 40

Wednesday June 14th
Began with strong gales from W by N and passing
clouds steered East saw finbacks one sail
in sight bound to the N.W. middle and after
part much the same. Lat 37 47 Long 39 30

Thursday June 15th
all this day strong breezes from the West
and squally saw a finback one sail steering
to the North and West Lat 39 18 Long 36 45

At the Western Shores

Friday June 16th
all this day strong winds from the West
and passing clouds steered East by South
saw a Brig in sight bound Westward saw
lots of finbacks Lat 39 52 Long 33 30

Saturday June 17th
all this day strong breezes from W by N and
hazy at 2 PM saw a Brig bearing South by
East 45 miles saw a ship at night going
for the windward tried to cut him off
but could not at 9 PM perceived the
S.E. end of Flores found the Barque Rifle
of New London then receding.

Sunday June 18th
all this day moderately gale and squalling
sent a boat on shore put a man on shore
sick.

Monday June 19th
all this day light Battering winds and
calms one watch on shore got off some
water got a Topin

Tuesday June 20th
all this day light winds from the S.W. and fine
weather one watch on shore got off some recruits

Wednesday June 21st
all this day strong breezes from the South
and West and squally got off some recruits

Thursday June 22nd
all this day strong breezes from the South
and West steered S.E. at 3 PM spoke the Barque
Leon of Mathapisset 8 months out and one
hundred and forty men at 5 PM
saw a jag at 11 PM in clear under the
George

Friday June 23rd
all this day strong breezes from the South
and West and passing clouds steered S.E.
at 12 PM Michael Rose S.E. dist 3 leagues
saw finbacks and Topins

Saturday June 24th
all this day strong breezes from the S. steered for
Medania 3 sails in sight Lat 41 24 Long 23 21
