

Monday Jan 29th

Begins with light winds from the SE and Pappin Clouds Steered to the SE at 11 AM Current setting to the NW at the rate of 2 1/2 miles per day middle part fine weather latter part strong trades and squally latter Do alt 15 25 long 3 45

Tuesday Jan 30th

All this day squally with a large sea Steered to the SE under double reefed top sails

Wednesday Jan 31st

Begins with fresh trades and Cloudy Steered East by Compass under double reefed top sails middle part with squalls the same at day light more squally to the SE Ends with strong trades and squally latter 15 45

Thursday Feb 1st

All this day strong trades and squally heading NW under double reefes

Friday Feb 2nd

Begins with moderate trades and Cloudy Steered to the NW heavy swell bearing from the SE at 3 PM Saw 2 Sails steering NW middle part clear latter part Cloudy Saw several Sails steering NW

Saturday Feb 3rd

Begins with light winds from the South Steered SE under a full sail 2 sails in sight steering NW middle part moderate and fine weather latter part light winds from the South and Pappin Clouds latter by Doubt alt 19 13

Sunday Feb 4th

Begins with light trades and fine weather headed East changed Calbars with a large Barque steering NW at 9 PM lashed to the SE middle and latter part some squally headed SE under short sail latter Do alt

long 2 55 West

Monday Feb 5th

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Begins with moderate trades and Pappin Clouds Steered to the middle part headed to the South and West under short squally latter strong breeze and squally latter 2 25 long 3 45

Tuesday Feb 6th

All this day strong trades and squally Steered NW under double reefed top sails long 5 45

Wednesday Feb 7th

All this day strong trades and squally Steered NW under double reefed top sails latter 9 25 long

Thursday Feb 8th

Begins with strong trades and squally Steered NW Saw some light squids one sail in sight steering North by Compass middle part Steered SE by Doubt under close reefed top sails latter part with much the same Steered NW by one sail in sight steering North latter 17 50 long 5 40

Friday Feb 9th

Begins with strong trades and squally Steered NW by one sail in sight at day light headed to the wind heading SE at day light squally Steered NW Ends with fine weather latter 15 30 long

Saturday Feb 10th

Begins with strong trades and Cloudy Steered NW by sunset Close reefed the top sails headed to the SE at day light Saw the Hatteras bearing NW dist 45 miles at sunset the middle of it bearing North got an albatross caught the phonometer several miles to the Westward there were sails in sight latter 16 41

Sunday Feb 11th

All this day light trades and fine weather Steered West at 4 PM made the Hatteras head of the 100 fathoms out in the latter 16 45 long
