Thursday May 3rd
At this day three breezes from the South
blew together & Mr General arrived at 11 AM
in sight at 10 AM spoke to Mr John
Adams of Providence & 6 days out End
with fresh breezes from the South
Feb 22 1818

Wednesday May 9th
Begins with fresh breeze from the South
inspiring Wharfy beach. With at sunset
shifted to backing W by S and close kept
the top sails middle part wind in evening
heavily, wore ship to the S & at day night
heavy gales from the S by and Squally &
a heavy sea the Brig. Robin heavy at
it kept fore sail tacked wellbore lat 29 35

Thursday May 16th
Began with strong breezes from the S.W.
and gradually shifted East under close reefed
of sails and fore sail at 9^{PM} now top leading
to the side middle part wither much the same
to the fore part more moderate but main sail full
turned the keel from the fore sail at 23⁴⁰
