

Saturday May 12th

Begins with moderate gales from N E and
A heavy swell the Brig. Rolling heavy
headly N W in middle part Cloudy with light
in the North latter Part in middle the N
all obs 30 20 long 76 15

Sunday May 13th

All the day moderate gales from the East
and fine weather headed N E under short
sail Several sails in sight to day
Lat 30 36 long 76 30

Monday May 14th

Begins with moderate gales from the N E
and fine weather headed North under short
sail middle light airs and calm at day light
much all sail heading N W E Ends with fine
weather two sails in sight Lat 31 10 long 76 15

Tuesday May 15th

Begins with light winds from E E and
fine weather headed N E Saw several
ships in sight from about the water Employed
sailing of new ship May sent up the Regat yard
middle and latter part rather much the same
Shore the N George & W. say of Westport
eaten mouth out for 1000 and part left with
gale on the 4th of April Lat 32 23 long 74 30

Wednesday May 16th

Begins with moderate gales from the N E and
fine weather headed N E in C with the large
ship at 5 PM saw a large Breach Clove
Ship and heard waves about 7 PM saw
Ship and moved to the N got pay boat saw Breach
appear the Run of and called the main top sail
back but saw nothing more could round
thru at while saw nothing but jumpers &
Popkins two sails in sight Lat 32 12
long 74 10

Thursday May 17th

All this day moderate gales from the N E Cloudy
and cold headed N E Saw some jumpers
one ship in sight from middle part Ends
with Rain Saw several ships at 12 Lat 32 11 long 72 25

Friday May 18th

Begins with moderate gales from the N E
heavy Rain headed N E at sunset saw
two ships in sight under close reefed top sail
middle part light winds from the East at day
light made all sail headed N W E wind to
saw at 12 ship steering the same course
Ends with squally weather

Saturday May 19th

Begins with moderate gales from the N E Cloudy
winds N E headed South by the squally
in the middle part squally with Rain
winds South latter part fine weather wind
N W headed N E Lat 32 00 long 71 45

Sunday May 20th

Begins with moderate gales and fine weather
headed N E winds N W Saw several pieces
of squid David Long promised to go to his
duty and behave well if his boys are taken off
But the crew all protested against his coming
amongst them again he is a man that can't
be trusted at sunset moved East under reefed
top sail middle part strong winds latter part
Cloudy much all sail Lat 31 45 long 68 51

Monday May 21st

Begins with strong winds from the N E and
squally appearances in the light moved East
under main sail jibs and close reefed
the top sails at 2 PM heavy squalls from the
West with thunder and lightning took in all
sail and lay headed to the South at 4 PM
more moderate sail under reefed top sails &
fore sail middle part squally appearances with
lightning in the N E and under reefed top sails
latter part strong breezes from the N W and heavy
sea running Lat 32 16 long 66 25
