

Brig Ocean of Sandwich

Thursday Jan 3rd

Begins with fine Breeze from the N.W. and rising clouds. Clear & at 3 P.M. sail Teneiffe in reach mid past light air and Calms at day light they then steered up from the South Steered in between Canary & Teneiffe En with strong wind and rising clouds

Friday Jan 4th

Begins with strong gale from S.W. and rising clouds. Close reefed the top sails and shifted the heading towards Teneiffe middle part heavy gale from the S.W. and squally steered to the North to clear the land and then went to under close reefing main top sail at 3 P.M. the wind shifted to the N.W. with heavy rain at 9 P.M. Teneiffe bearing N.W. set the top sail and stave etc

Saturday Jan 5th

Begins with strong gale from the N.W. at 5 P.M. high sea the weather thick and squally. Squall etc at 2 P.M. Clear a little sails the fogged Canary were ship and steered for the South part of it middle part with Boffing and thick at day light strong breeze from S.W. steered in between Teneiffe and Canary at 10 P.M. heavy gale from S.W. Close reefed the top sails and shifted to the wind heading towards Teneiffe

Sunday Jan 6th

Begins with heavy gale from S.W. and clear weather towards the Canary at 4 P.M. increasing gale looking the fore top sail and stave with to clear the land middle part heavy gale with squalls of rain the brig heading S.W. at 3 P.M. the wind shifted to the North and moderate with thick rain weather at 8 P.M. Clear a little Teneiffe the North part of Teneiffe bearing N.W. set 3 leagues set the fore top sail and stave East ends with strong winds from the N.W. and squally look in the West Coast

Bound for the Canaries 1855

Monday Jan 7th

Begins with strong gale from the N.W. inclining Westward steered S.W. for the S.E. part of the Grand Canary middle part lay under the lee of Canary with Boffing wind and at heavy sea stave past heavy gale from the S.W. Steered S.W. under close reefed top sails at 10 P.M.

Tuesday Jan 8th

Begins with heavy gale from the S.W. and squalls were ship to the North & West at 2 P.M. were ship to the S.W. the brig under close reefed main top sail and fore top mast stay sail reefed fore sail & top sail at 5 P.M. increasing gale and at 8 P.M. look in the fore sail middle part heavy gale from N.W. and squally at day light were ship to N.W. sent down top S. yard Ends with heavy squalls and a tremendous sea running

Wednesday Jan 9th

Begins with heavy gale from the S.W. and squally were ship to the North & East at 2 P.M. moderated set the fore top sail at 4 P.M. turned the keels from the fore sail middle part signed from West West and moderate headed S.W. at day light steered up the main top S. yard and snuck all sail headed S.W. Ends with fine weather put out the main Coast

Thursday Jan 10th

all this day moderate gale and rising clouds steered to the West of Bent & young main sail and fore top sail Lat 25 15 N

Friday Jan 11th

Begins with fine Breeze from N.W. and rising clouds steered to the S.W. at 4 P.M. saw the Coast middle part wind inclining Northward squall sail at day light snuck all sail and stave in for the land Bent the cables etc

Saturday Jan 12th

all this day fine breeze from the N.W. and fore part steered to the S.W. along shore land in sight
