

# Schr. Aurora to Barbadoes.

Sunday, April, 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1883  
All these 24 hours moderate breezes from the Eastward, steering, West.

Lat. 12.41<sup>W</sup>

Long. 53.36<sup>W</sup>

Monday, April, 23<sup>rd</sup>

All these 24 hours moderate breezes from E. N. E. steering West, and W. by North, watch variously employed in ship duty.

Lat. 12.48

Long. 53.37

Tuesday April 24<sup>th</sup>

All these 24 hours moderate, E. N. E. hauled steering, West, by North.

Lat. 13.05

Long. 53.12

Wednesday, April, 25<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begin with moderate breezes from Eastward, steering, W. by S. at 6 P.M. saw the Island of Barbadoes bearing W. by South, at 9 P.M. saw the light on the East point, bore to at 10 P.M. and lay on different tracks until 4 A.M. the light came in and dropped anchor in Carlisle Bay in five fathoms of water, at 11 A.M.

Thursday, April, 26<sup>th</sup>

All these 24 hours fine weather lying at anchor employed scrubbing ship, breaking out and loosing oil and ship work in general. (Note) today discharged Monro, Jones. The man that was 2nd Officer.

Friday April 27<sup>th</sup>

Lying at anchor employed breaking out oil and discharged it also employed painting the vessel outside

# Aurora at Barbadoes.

Saturday, April, 28<sup>th</sup>, 1883  
All these 24 hours lying at anchor employed painting ship, pumping salt water and various other jobs, rather rather squally.

Sunday, April, 29<sup>th</sup>

Still lying at anchor first part painting last part Starboard watch ashore on liberty Thomas Jones deserted.

Monday, April, 30<sup>th</sup>

All these 24 hours remained lying at anchor employed painting ship Port watch ashore on liberty, one boatsteerer and one man forward deserted, shipped, sent to the third mate as bedstewer.

Tuesday, May, 1<sup>st</sup>  
All these 24 hours lying at anchor employed painting and taking in fresh water Starboard watch ashore on liberty, two men deserted Thomas Jones and a Portuguese.

Wednesday May, 2<sup>nd</sup>  
Still lying at anchor employed taking in water wood and provisions

Thursday, May, 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Still lying at anchor finished wood and nails and stowed off the holes Port three of the Port watch ashore on liberty.

Friday, May, 4<sup>th</sup>  
Still lying at anchor two of crew deserted, Mr. Bats, & Mr. Chandler all hands employed setting up head gear and various other work.

Saturday, May, 5<sup>th</sup>  
Remained at anchor employed painting Boats setting up rigging.

Sunday, May 6<sup>th</sup>  
Remained lying at anchor
