Comes in with light baffling air from all parts of the compass, and calm. Ship working to the N with all present sail out at M. finished boiling there 25 Bbls turned up on deck. In the P.M. saw porpoises - several pieces squid - good seeing all day

Friday May 29th

Light baffling air from the S.E. and cloudy weather. Ship cruising to the N good seeing - nothing in sight at M. Fresh breezes from S.W. and light showers of rain. Two sail in sight steering to the W. and one steering to the E.

Saturday May 30th

Light air from S.E. and fine weather. Ship working to the E. at 10 spoke ship. Rhine of New York 7 days bound to London sent by her letter. Nothing more in sight all day

Sunday May 31st 1868

Begins with moderate breezes from S.W. and cloudy weather. Ship steering S.E. per compass, with all present sail out. Two sail steering to the E. and one to the N. nothing more in sight - quite good seeing all day

Monday June 1st

Comes in with strong breezes from S.W. and cloudy weather. Ship by the wind heading S.E. with all present sail out. Mid part steering E. by N. One sail in sight

Lat at Merd 39 50
Long by Chron 57 10

Tuesday June 2nd

Comes in with light air from S.W. and showery. Steering E. by N. per compass. One sail in sight steering to the E. mid and south part wind S.W. good seeing all day - nothing in sight
