

Sunday June 28th 1868
all these 24 hours light baffling air
and pleasant weather. Ship becalmed
on the South side of the island. Mick
and Lat. part working through

Monday June 29th 1868
all these 24 hours light baffling air
from the N.E. Ship working to the
N.E. have five Tortoisere green
hank on board. One shipped at
Fagal and the other 4 showed away on
board at Fagal. Found our large
Chronometer 75 miles too far E and the
small one 15 miles.

Tuesday June 30th
All these 24 hours light baffling air
from the N and E. and calm. Ship
working to the N with all sail out
Cooper setting up shanks. Saw one
sail steering for Fagal. Saw the
islands of P. Fagal, Fico, St. George
and Graciosa. Saw porpoises
albacore and shoals of small fish
also toad stools, tallow drops and
sungalls, there being good in-
dications for sperm Whales.
16 Obs,

Wednesday July 1st 1868
light baffling air from the N and E
and calm. Ship by the wind heading
N and N.W. with all sail out
this morning sent aloft fore gall. yard
bent the sail and set it. Saw
the island of Graciosa bearing S
S by her compass East. 20 miles
at N. Saw several sail all
was king to the E but one schooner
that is working W. Saw plenty of
tallow drops sungalls and toad stools
water blue and clear.

Thursday July 2^d
light baffling air from the N and E.
and squally weather. Ship by the wind
first on one tack then the other. The wind
shifting from one quarter to another con-
tinually. Several sail in sight all
working to the E. In the night
heavy squalls and rainy.
