

Tuesday June 1st 1869

Comes in with light baffling winds from the S and NW and fine pleasant weather. Ship working up the passage from the N at Sagal. at Sagal Bk. Henry Brazier - Couswell, et al. 19 men out. 2350 Bbls Appam Oil obtained 100 Cabbages. 4000 onions from the shore and other recruits - at night went on board and worked up to the south for the purpose of going to Pico for a 3rd mate. all night light baffling winds

Wednesday June 2nd 1869

Comes in with light baffling winds from the S and fine pleasant weather. Ship working down the south side of Pico for a landing place called San Juan to obtain a man for 3rd mate. at 1 P.M. left the ship for the shore and landed at 4. saw and agreed with Manuel Sylwia to go as 3rd mate and ship keeper. to go on board in the P.M. tomorrow all night going off and on with light baffling winds and fine weather

Thursday June 3rd 1869

Comes in with light baffling winds from the S.W. and fine weather. Ship cruising of San Juan waiting for Frank Glynn. Saw plenty of porpoises. at 2 P.M. saw two thimblebacks. lowered and chased them with two boats. followed them in up to the breakers. at 4 P.M. boat went in for Frank Glynn. He came on board at sunset with his clothes. made agreement with him to go for the season for the 1/42 bag - advanced him cash \$40⁰⁰ and 1 Box Tobacco 122 lb @ 40 c - 45.80 c all night light baffling winds and squally weather

Friday June 4th

Comes in with moderate breezes from the W and NW and somewhat hazy weather. Ship steering off to the N and E with all sail. and saw plenty porpoises and two or three finback. bombed one. he went down and we saw him no more at sunset off W end of. Herceira wind out to the N. and cloudy weather
