Thursday August the 25th 1870
First part of this day strong winds from
S.W. the ship heading S.E. took in the
main sail & jib at sunset the weather a
but the same Middle part light weather
at day light calm set all sail the ship
steering S.W. saw nothing so ended
this day. Lat. 40° 09' N
Long 42° 10' W

Friday August the 26th
First part of this day very light weather
at sunset the weather a but the same
Middle & latter part calm so ended
the day. Lat. 40° 15' N
Long 42° 11' W

Saturday August the 27th
First part of this day calm & light air
from N.W. the ship heading S.W.
at sundown still calm the ship still
with all sail out Middle & latter part
fine pleasant weather & sail in sight
Lat. 40° 14' N

Sunday August the 28th Sea Lang
This day still commenced with very
pleasant weather the ship heading N.W.
at one P.M. spoke the Barque Japan.
Dawson with nothing at sunset took in
the light sail, Middle & latter part
fresh winds from N.W. & so ended
this day. No abo.

Monday August the 29th 1870.
First part of this day strong winds
from N.W. the ship steering W.

Tuesday August the 30th

same so ended.

Wednesday August the 31st 31
First part of this day fine pleasant
weather the ship steering North Middle
& latter part still fine weather
so ended.

Thursday September the 1st
First part of this day calm & very light
air the ship still steering North with
all sail out the light air from N.W.
latter part calm nothing in sight
so ended this day.

Friday September the 2nd
First part of this day fine pleasant
weather Middle & latter part the
same nothing in sight so ended
this day.
