First part light breeze from N.E. still
one sail in sight at sunset tacked
ship to the East middle part tacked again
to the N.W. at 2.30 Am tacked to the
E.S.E. the breeze very light at 8 Am
tacked again to the N.W. 2 sails in sight
so ended, this day Sat 7.59 S

Wednesday April the 17th
First part fine light breeze the ship
heading N.N.E. still one sail in sight
at sunset a but the same middle
latter part calm saw one sail so
ended, this day Sat 7.13 S

Long 32.34 m

Thursday April the 18th
First part calm at sunset still calm
the ship heading S.E. middle & latter
part calm saw a stamer still in
sight an ship duty so ended, this
day Sat 6.53 S

Friday April the 19th 1872
First part of this day light pleasant
breeze from the East the ship heading
North by the wind middle & latter part
light airs one sail in sight still enplan
an ship duty so ended, this day
Sat 5.58 S

Saturday April the 20th
First part light airs & calm still
one sail in sight at sunset the a but
the same the ship heading from N.W.
N.W. middle & latter part fine
breeze from S the ship steering North
nothing so ended, this day
Sat 5.15 S

Long 34.02 m

Sunday April the 21st
First part fine breeze & light squally
one sail in sight at sunset calm &
light squally, middle & latter part
the wind from N.E. & W the ship heading
from E to N.W. several sail, in
sight so ended, this day Sat 4.31 S

Long 34.14 m

Monday April the 22nd
First part fine breeze from W the ship
steering N.W. at sunset calm
several sail in sight middle
latter part very light airs still 3 sails
in sight so ended, this day
Sat 4.00 S
