

Remarks On Board Ship Lemulgee

Sunday Dec 3^d 1834

First part Light breeze from the North
staring in for the land Mid & Latter gentle breeze
and fine weather at 11 A.M. were ship to the Eastward
the land about 10 miles off the several sail in sight

Monday 4th

First part fresh breeze from the North at 1 P.M.
saw and chased a whale with out success
Mid & Latter fresh breeze at 9 A.M. of the ship
Barclay of New Bedford fuller weather & fine

Tuesday 5th

First part fresh breeze from the North and cloudy
at 4 P.M. saw several whales chased which one
in company with the Barclay at 7 A.M. took him
to the ship and got ready for cutting Mid & Latter
fresh gale and rain cut the whale in 18



Wednesday 6th

First part fresh rain Mid & Latter strong breeze
and some rain started the works & fine

Thursday 7th

First part light breeze from the North and
fine weather Mid & Latter the same & fine
saw several sail

Friday 8th

First part fine weather at 2 P.M. the ship Barclay
took 45 lbs of oil from this ship Mid & Latter
Moderate of the dark sky of Eastward 11 A.M. cut
5.30 lbs of oil 250 whole saw and chased two whales
& fine

First part light breeze and fine weather ship on
different tacks Mid & Latter the same & fine

First part light breeze from the North and
fine clear weather heading to the E.N.E. Mid & Latter
the same saw two Humpbacks the Lat 36.50

Long 9.01

Monday 11th

First part gentle breeze from the North and fine
weather ship with all sail out Mid & Latter part
much the same heading to the south & fine Lat 36.30

Long 8.00

Tuesday 12th

First part fresh breeze from the North and fine
weather at 4 P.M. spoke the bark of Sag Harbor
2 whales Mid & Latter Moderate the Lat 37.15

Wednesday 13th

First part Moderate and fine clear weather
at 8 A.M. spoke the bark R. L. Barston of Montserrat
cutting their first whale Mid & Latter fine weather
saw several sail & fine

Long 7.40

Thursday 14th

First part gentle breeze from the North heading
to the Eastward at 11 A.M. spoke the bark Draco of
New Bedford 200 lbs of sperm 1 right whale also ship
Columbus of New London heading East saw a right
whale Mid & Latter strong breeze ship starting E. & fine
& fine
