

Remarks On Board Ship Comulge

Wednesday April 30th 1853

First part fresh gale from the S.E. and cloudy at 2 P.M. took in the fore sail and left to heading E.N.E. under breast reef main top sail Mid part more moderate latter part light breeze and thick fog to ends No Ob.

Thursday 21st

First part light breeze from the N.W. and thick fog latter part strong breeze from the N.W. and clearing steering N. saw several humpbacks and sunbarks to ends No Ob.

Friday 22nd

Strong breeze from the N.W. and cloudy steering N. mid & latter part fresh gale and some snow to ends Lat 44 30 Long 152 17

Saturday 23rd

First part strong breeze from the N.W. heading to the N.W. set the top sails double reef Mid & latter moderate saw plenty of sunbarks heading to the N.W. some snow to ends Lat 46 00 Long 152 03

Sunday 24th

First part strong breeze from the N.W. and some snow heading to the N.W. plenty of sunbarks in sight Mid & latter part strong breeze and plenty of snow heading to the South saw plenty of sunbarks to ends Lat No Ob

Monday 25th

First part strong breeze from the N.W. and foggy heading to the South mid & latter strong gale from the N.W. and squally took in the fore sail &c Lat 45 15 Long 154 09

of Isbury Marthas Vineyard Mass.

Thursday April 26th 1853

First part more moderate but the fore sail heading S mid & latter part fresh gale and snow wore ship to the N.W. and took in the fore sail to ends Lat 45 17 N Long 155 44 E.

Friday 27

First part fresh gale from the S.W. and squally with snow heading to the N.W. under breast reef main top sail Mid & latter the same to ends Lat 45 30 Long 155 19

Saturday 28th

First part fresh gale from the N.W. and squally with snow heading to the N.W. Mid & latter more moderate and thick fog to ends No Ob

Sunday 29th

First part moderate gale from the S.W. and thick heading N.W. Mid & latter part heavy gale from the South ship lying to under breast reef main top sail squally with rain &c to ends No Ob.

Monday 30th

First part more moderate with rain heading N.W. Mid & latter part moderate saw plenty of sunbarks ship steering N.W. to ends Lat 47 00 Long 155 25

Tuesday May 1st 1853

First part fresh wind from the N.W. at 2 P.M. strong gale took in sail at 6 took in the fore sail Mid & latter moderate made sail heading N.W. saw plenty of sunbarks to ends Lat 45 00 Long 155 28
