

Remarks On Board Ship Cumulgee

Monday June 4th 1835

First part Light air from the S.W. and some thick mid is latter part moderate breeze from the S.E. and some thick & mid Lat 55 48 Long 146 02

Tuesday 5th

First part Light breeze from the S.E. and some thick ship working to the South Long with the S.E. Mid is latter part much the same at 8 A.M. spoke ship Sheffield of Cobol Spring 2 whales this season to India of New Bedford, 1 whale to New Bedford of New Bedford & 1 whale, Sully

Wednesday 6th

First part Light breeze from the S.E. and thick working to the South Mid is latter much the same working Long the S.E. & mid

Thursday 7th

First part light air from the S.E. and thick at 3 P.M. spoke the Bark Harvest of Fairhaven 2 whales from the Japan sea Mid is latter part thick fog, have not seen any ice think are on sides of it working to the Westward slowly & mid

Friday 8th

First part Light air and thick fog Mid and latter much the same saw two ships working to the westward have not seen any ice Lat 55 00 Long 145 30

Saturday June 9th 1835

First part calm and a thick fog Mid is latter part light air from the Eastward Lat up for a few hours and then came in as thick as our ship had the sail in it at 11 came up with the S.E.

Sunday 10th

First part light air from the Eastward and thick the ice all around at 4 P.M. Lat up saw Cape Maria Baring S.W. 6 Dist 20 miles saw ice all around from S. to N. and very heavy ice spoke the Bark Melwood of New Bedford nothing this season more ship to the Eastward Mid fresh breeze from the Eastward with thunder and lightning and fresh rain latter gentle breeze from the N.E. and quite clear ship raising East & mid Lat 55 05 Long 144 00

Monday 11th

First part fresh breeze from the N.W. and quite clear steering S.E. saw several sail rounding to the S.W. at 4 came in thick Lat up Mid is latter part moderate and some thick S. mid Lat 55 05 Long 144 15

Tuesday 12th

First part light air from the North and some thick at 3 P.M. saw several empty casks put them up and four bundles of shuck to cast hoops saw lots of drift stuff at 8 A.M. spoke the ship Bart Gasmola of New Bedford nothing this season learnt from her that the Edger of Cobol Spring had gone on shore on Jonas Island six days before and was lost then mid the Bart Gasmola did not up with ice latter thick fog in the S.E.
