

Remarks On Board Ship Columbus

Wednesday June 13<sup>th</sup> 1855

First part light and thick saw the ice  
Mid & Latter calm and thick spoke the bark  
Robert Morrison of New Bedford nothing this  
season & no

Thursday 14

First part calm and some thick. Boat up  
two empty casks and some others Mid & Latter  
light air good land in sight 15 miles off and  
bark of ships & birds

Friday 15<sup>th</sup>

First part light air and fine weather  
Boat up two casks of bit the island 3 miles off  
Mid & Latter light air working to the westward  
to get clear of the ice so as to go south of the  
ice in sight & bird

Saturday 16<sup>th</sup>

Light breeze from the N.W. heading to the  
westward Mid & Latter strong breeze working to the  
port the ice breaking off from the land a long distance  
& birds the land in sight Lat 59.00

Sunday 17<sup>th</sup>

Light breeze and fine weather at 4 p.m. spoke  
the ship Corinthian of New Bedford a small whale  
so that he can't get within ten miles of the  
shores east of Flaming N.B. Mid & Latter fresh breeze  
running down with the land saw several ships

of Lisbury, Matthias Vinyard Mps

Monday June 18<sup>th</sup> 1855

Light breeze from the westward steering  
to the S. the land in sight Mid & Latter calm  
& birds Lat 59.00

Long 143.40

Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup>

First part light air and fine weather running  
with the land Mid & Latter moderate one boat  
went on shore saw nothing & birds

Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup>

Light air and fine weather running long with the  
land saw plenty of ice Mid & Latter moderate  
the boat went on shore to look for whales & birds

Thursday 21<sup>st</sup>

Light breeze and fine weather at 3 p.m. the boat came  
on board saw nothing Mid & Latter moderate  
the boat went in to a deep bay in Lat 59.10 Long 144.30  
saw one bowhead & birds

Friday 22<sup>nd</sup>

First part light air and fine weather Mid calm  
the light breeze at 3 p.m. the boat went in saw one  
whale & birds

Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup>

First part light breeze from the S and some thick  
at 4 p.m. kept on steering to the eastward a long with  
the land Mid & Latter part saw thick rising bowhead  
island in sight & birds
