

Remarks On Board Ship Comulga

Sunday June 24th 1835

First part Light air and some thick.
 Landing in to Gulf of Sacoish saw several
 Ships Mid is latter part fine weather at 6 A.M.
 spoke the Moravia of New Bedford 13 whales this season
 had some quite a number of but was now all
 gone four ships in site

Monday 25th

First part Light breeze and fine weather
 Mid is latter part light air and some thick spoke
 the Woods boat and Midas had got nothing in
 the Bay Islands

Tuesday 26th

First part Light air and some rain saw several
 ships at anchor under Galois Island took a boat
 and went in saw the Cambria one whale Washington
 had just cut 6 small whales Mamirica 3 Chao
 Caroline & taken in the Bay Mid is latter
 gentle breeze strong P.D. saw a right whaling

Wednesday 27th

First part Light breeze and fine weather
 Mid is latter part same P.D. Lgt 55. 10
Long 152. 45

Thursday 28th

First part Light breeze from the North and
 fine weather strong P.D. Mid is latter Light breeze
 and some thick to end

Friday 29th

First part Light air and some thick heading to
 the South Mid is latter part Light air and fine weather
 at 9 A.M. saw and sunset for two right thick one over
 the line parted last the whale

of Isbury, Martha's Vineyard & Nps

Saturday 30th 1835

First part Light air and some thick sunset
 for whales at 4 P.M. thick and killed one and
 took him to the ship plenty of whales in site all
 large whales Mid is latter part some thick at 9 A.M. got
 through cutting to end Lgt 55. 30
Long 152. 15

Sunday July 1st 1835

First part Strong breeze from the North saw whales
 started the north saw five ships Boiling Mid is latter
 fine weather to end Lgt 55. 40
Long 152. 12

Monday 2nd

First part Light breeze and fine weather at
 6 A.M. struck a whale and the fine parted last
 the saw small whale Mid is latter fine weather
 for a whale without success and employed in
 Boiling 8 ships in site Lgt 55. 34

Tuesday 3rd

First part Light air and fine weather sunset
 for two whales 9 ships in site Mid is latter part
 Light air and thick got through Boiling 8 ships

Wednesday 4th

First part Light air and thick saw two
 whales Mid is latter part much the same
 employed in Boiling about 8 miles

Thursday 5th

First part Light air from the North and fine
 clear weather saw and chased two whales saw a ship
 get a whale Lgt 55. 30
Long 152. 05
 Latter part Strong gale and thick from the N.E. took in
 the fore and Mizen top sail first time for two months & met
