Wednesday Aug 25th 1853

First part Light Breeze from the North and thick heading E.N.E. Mid & Latter part Light Breeze from the North and fine weather employed in Stowing down at 10.00 M. Spoke the Ship Washington of New Bedford 30th this season

Thursday 30th

First part Light Breeze and fine weather at 5.00 got through Stowing saw one right whale Mid & Latter part Breeze from the Westward and struck a whale and drew out the whale. Lat

Friday 31st

First part Strong Breeze and rugged chest a whale Mid Strong Breeze and fresh rain Latter moderate gale and drew three Ship in site of birds

Saturday Sept 1st 1853

First part Strong Breeze from the Westward and clear Mid & Latter moderate saw and chest several whales to birds

Sunday 3rd

First part Light Breeze from the Westward and fine at 1.00 M. Struck a whale and drew out the whale saw and chest several others Mid & Latter Moderate saw and chest a whale & Ship in site two Boiling S. D. D.

Monday 3rd

First part Light Breeze from the South saw and chest two whales color was fast Mid & Latter Strong Breeze and thick S. D. D.

Tuesday Sept 4th 1853

First part Strong Breeze from the N.E. and quite clear at 3.00 M. saw and chest a whole Lundered three without success Mid & Latter Strong Breeze and thick S. D. D.

First part Strong Breeze from the Westward and saw thick Mid & Latter Strong Breeze and fine weather Piering N.E. S. D. D.

Thursday 6th

First part fresh Breeze from the P.M. and fine weather at 3.00 M. Spoke the Ship Unward of New Bedford 3 whales this season at 5.00 M. Struck and killed a whale at 7.00 M. took him to the Ship and took in sail Mid Strong Breeze Latter Strong Breeze from P.D. and rugged more around out to seaward got the head all clear and two Blanket Pieces in the Piece here of the mast under the Ship. more came up on the other side but on an other chance took both shores in the base took the whole on the Starboard side Blowing a heavy gale took in the Main top sail to the

Friday 7th

First part heavy gale from the E.N.E. and rugged at 2.00 M. the chance parted lost the whale at 3.00 M. the wind shifted to the N.W. and the main top sail chest right heading to the N.W. mid part wind from West Blowing very heavy in squalls with a heavy sea on Latter more moderate two Ship in site S. D. D.
