

Remarks On Board Ship Cumulgee

Thursday Sept 30th 1835

First part light air from the North and cloudy with a heavy swell. on saw and chased a whale which is latter part strong breeze from E & S heading to the North saw a whale going quick to the Westward to Encke

Sept 33. 02

Long 152. 38

Friday 31st

First part strong breeze from the East and rugged saw two whales going quick at 6 AM. spoke the ship

Carolina of New Bedford 34 m out 500 lb sperm 700 lb whale saw this season Mid is latter fresh gale at 8 AM. spoke the ship Jeanette of New Bedford 13 m out 400 lb whale 60 of sperm saw several right whales today

Saturday 2nd

First part strong breeze from the East and rugged saw whales Mid is latter moderate and fine weather at 9 AM. several thick a whale and chased lost this whale to Encke

160 lb

Sunday 23rd

First part light breeze from the N. and cloudy at 1 P.M. several thick and killed a whale at 4 took him to the ship hoist on hook in head throat is lips and let him lay till morning at daylight down in the body. Perked the works several for a whale strong breeze and rugged today

Sept 32. 55

Monday 24th

First part strong breeze and rugged spoke the ship Nimrod of New Bedford 130 lb. let him have two casks of water Mid is latter fresh gale from N.W. and cloudy employed in boiling today

First part fresh gale from the N.W. and rugged Mid is latter fresh gale today employed in boiling

Sept 33. 33

Wednesday 26th

Long 153. 20

First part fresh gale from the N.W. and rugged at 6 AM. spoke the ship Charles Phelps of Stonington 160 lb. 800 lb this season Mid is latter part fresh gale got through boiling today

Sept 32. 21

Thursday 27th

First part fresh gale from the N.W. and rugged Mid is latter more moderate employed in boiling today

Friday 28th

First part light breeze from the Westward employed in boiling Mid is latter moderate saw and chased whales plenty of whales in site to Encke

Saturday 29th

First part light breeze from the Westward and fine weather saw and chased whales saw plenty of whales Mid is latter fine weather at 7 AM. several for whales thick one and killed him at 10 AM. took him to the ship and commenced cutting today

Sept 32. 41

Sunday 30th

First part light air from the N.W. and fine weather several ships in site at 3 P.M. got through cutting. William Butte got his arm broke Perked the works Mid is latter moderate spoke the ship Charles Phelps saw one whale going quick today
