Monday Oct 1st 1833

First part Light air from the NW and fine weather employed in Boiling at 4 P.M. Spoke the Ship Montezuma of New London 800 lbs this season at 11 A.M. Spoke the Ship California of New Bedford nothing to be seen
Lat 33.32

Tuesday 2nd

First part Light Breeze from the SE and cloudy sea and last two whels saw a ship got a whale
Mid to latter Strong Breeze and rugged with rain got through Boiling several Ship in site. Lat 33.00

Wednesday 3rd

First part moderate gale and rising from the SE. Mid to latter part fresh gale from the W.N.W. with heavy squalls employed in Stowing aboard the After hatch several Ship in site. Lat 33.00

Thursday 4th

First part Strong gale from West and squally got through Stowing mid moderate latter Light air from the Westward at 8 A.M. Sighted for whales struck one the first Iron shew and the short warp parted lost the whole saw and lost more saw three Ship Stowing to the S.E. Lat 32.38

Friday 5th

First part Light air from the Westward with a heavy swell at 8 A.M. Spoke the Ship John Howland of New Bedford 600 lbs this season Mid to latter Strong Breeze from the Westward and rugged saw three Ships Lat 32.35

Saturday Oct 6th 1833

First part Strong Breeze from the Westward and some thick Mid to latter part Strong Breeze and some thick at 9 A.M. Spoke the Ship Eliza Adams of New Bedford 1100 lbs this season Lat 32.15

Sunday 7th

First part Strong Breeze from the S.W. and some thick Ship under double reef Mid to latter part the same saw finbacks saw the E. Adams Lat 33.00
Long 134.07

Monday 8th

First part Strong Breeze from the S.W. and some thick Ship on different tacks Mid to latter much the same saw finbacks Lat 33.00

Tuesday 9th

First part Strong Breeze from the S.W. and thick Ship under double reef Mid to latter Strong gale from the S.W. and some rain Ship heading West Lat 33.30
Long 132.48 E

Wednesday 10th

First part fresh gale from the W.N.W. and squally at 1 P.M. wore Ship to the South at 3 set abast reef top sails Mid squally latter more moderate made sail heading S.E. Lat 32.35
Long 133.14

Thursday 11th

First part Strong Breeze from the S.W. heading S.E. at 4 P.M. took in the Main top gallant sail and set the Fore to the fore top sails Mid squally latter the same shifted to the W.N.W. at 7 A.M. left off Stowing S.E. with a strong breeze and fine weather Lat 31.05 Long 134.00
