Monday Oct. 22^d 1855

First part strong gale from the N.W. and squalls not quite so heavy strong S.E. with a clear reef main top sail at 4 P.M. sent the fore top sail clear reef mid & latter part more moderate shook out the reefs sent the main top gallant sail fine clear weather John

Tuesday 23^d

Lat 43° 52' Long 173° 25' W

First part moderate breeze and fine weather from N.W. strong S.E. mid moderate latter strong breeze from the S.E. and thick rain double reef the top sails heading East took in the main sail John

Wednesday 24^d

First part fresh gale from the S.W. and rain heading East took in the top sail at 5 P.M. heading S.E. under double reef main top sail and fore sail mid & latter strong breeze and thick rain sent the fore and main top sails to sea

First part strong breeze from the S.W. and thick rain strong S.E. mid & latter part strong wind from the S.W. thick with clear reef fore and main top sails and double reef main and fore sail

First part strong breeze from the S.W. and thick rain strong S.E. at 4 P.M. the wind shifted to the N.W. with moderate breeze and thick shook out the reefs mid & latter moderate breeze from the N.W. and some rain strong S.E. to sea

First part light from the S.W. and rain strong S.E. with all sail out mid moderate latter strong breeze from the S.W. and some squally saw a flock of blackfish sent down the fore top sail to repair at 12 P.M. sent it up again to sea

First part strong breeze from the N.E. and squally with rain strong S.E. with all sail out mid & latter strong breeze from S.E. and squally with rain took in the gallant sails and double reef the top sails John

Monday 29^d

First part strong breeze and rain with heavy squalls from the S.W. strong S.E. mid strong took in the main sail and fore sail latter strong gale took in the top sails at 4 P.M. took in the fore sail clear reef the main top sails at 11 P.M. sent a reef fore sail to sea

Lat 31° 44' Long 161° 00'

Tuesday 30^d

First part more moderate sent the top sails clear reef heading S.E. with cloudy weather mid & latter more moderate shook out the reef heading from S.E. to south to sea

Lat 29° 30' N

Long 160° 55' W

Wednesday 31^d

First part strong breeze from the S.E. and rain heading S. at 4 P.M. sent to the N.E. mid & latter strong breeze from the S.E. and cloudy reef the top sails heading S.E. to sea

First part strong breeze from the S.E. and cloudy heading S.E. mid & latter strong breeze and rugged heading S.E. to sea
