Monday April 7th 1855

First part Light breeze from the S.W. and fine weather during E.M. along the land for the Pirates of Cora Mid light breeze and fine weather
 Latter calm and fine weather saw several Fish Boats to land in site 2 hrs

Tuesday 8th

First part Light air from the S.W. and fine weather during E.M. the land in site. Mid Light breeze from S.W. Latter Light breeze from the S.W. and cloudy heading east

Wednesday 9th

First part Gentle breeze from the N.W. and cloudy heading at 6 A.M. saw the land were ship to the S.W. Mid Light breeze from the S.W. Latter Strong breeze saw two right whales to the N.E. and one to the S.W.

First part fresh gale from the E.M. and rugged ship an different tides that fresh latter Strong breeze and cloudy at 7 A.M. saw and chased a right whale with success heading to the Eastward 2 hrs

First part Gentle breeze from the S.W. and fine weather heading East at dark took in sail Mid Light breeze at daylight saw a hump back during 1st about 15 miles to the S.W.

First part Light breeze from the S.W. and fine weather saw and chased whales Mid Latter Strong gale from the S.W. and clear took in sail 2 hrs

First part Strong gale from the S.W. and clear took in the fore sail Mid part more moderate Latter moderate breeze from the S.W. and fine weather saw and chased whales 2 hrs several ships in site one boiling

First part Gentle breeze from the S.W. and fine weather working to the Eastward saw and chased whales at 7 A.M. spoke the Bark of E. C. Conwell of New Bedford 1 whale this season & Bark Leiner of N. nothing this season Mid & Latter Light breeze and fine weather 2 hrs
