

Remarks On Board Ship Comtee

Friday April 18th 1858

First part Light breeze from the South and fine weather saw and chased two whales. Mid moderate latter strong breeze double reefed thick rain at 12 took in the top sails raining to end

Saturday 19th

First part Strong gale from the S.W. and thick rain. Mid smooth the same latter moderate breeze and clear with a heavy swell on sea and chased whales to end

Lat 38° 34'

Sunday 20th

First part Gentle breeze from the S.W. and fine weather saw and chased whales. Mid foggy latter fine weather. Sailed several times to end

Lat 38° 41'

Monday 21st

Long 133° 48'

First part Strong breeze from E.S.E. and cloudy. Mid & latter strong gale from the East ship lying to to end

Lat 38° 38'

Tuesday 22nd

First part fresh gale from the East and rugged. Mid & latter much the same to end

Wednesday 23rd

First part strong gale and rugged one ship in sight. Mid & latter fine weather. Light breeze from the Westward to end

Thursday April 24th 1858

First part Light breeze from the W.S.W. and fine weather saw and chased a whale. Mid & latter light breeze and fine weather to end

Lat 38° 34'

Friday 25th

Long 135° 00'

First part Light air and fine weather heading to the Westward. Mid & latter thick foggy to end

Saturday 26th

First part Light air from the S.E. and a thick fog. Mid & latter thick with fresh rain. Spoke the Charles Phelps of Stonington nothing this season to end

Sunday 27th

First part Light breeze from the S.E. and thick rain. Mid & latter moderate gale and some thick ship lying to two ships in sight to end

Lat 38° 00'

Monday 28th

Long 134° 30'

First part fresh gale from the W.S.W. and squally. Mid strong gale. Latter more moderate. Put the top sails two ship in sight to end

Lat 38° 15'

Tuesday 29th

First part strong breeze from the W.S.W. and rugged saw and chased whales at 5 P.M. Spoke the ship George of New Bedford 1 whale this season. Mid moderate. Latter gentle breeze from the S.W. and thick fog. To end saw two whales
