

Remarks On Board Ship Comulge

Thursday Aug 21st 1835

First strong breeze from the South and thick fog mid thick latter strong breeze and quite clear saw plenty of finbacks & Inds

Friday 22nd

Long 148.40

First part strong breeze from the South and some thick during the night mid & latter strong breeze and thick fog employed in setting up the decks & Inds

Saturday 23rd

First part strong breeze from the South and thick fog ship on different tacks under short sail mid is latter fresh breeze and quite thick saw a ship cutting & Inds

Sunday 24th

First part strong breeze from the South and thick mid thick latter light breeze and fine weather saw plenty of whales several took one and the crew broke and lost John the Jeanette boat saw them strike and soon a whale & Inds came in thick

Monday 25th

First part strong breeze from the South and thick fog saw several whales mid is latter moderate lighted up about one hour saw and looked for a whale had to come on board again to Inds saw a ship

of Disbury Marthas Vineyard Mass

Tuesday Aug 25th 1835

First moderate breeze from the South and thick fog mid is latter thick fog & Inds

Wednesday 27th

First light air and thick fog mid is latter thick saw finbacks & Inds

Thursday 28th

First part light air and some thick at 4 P.M. lighted up saw these ships mid is latter light breeze and quite clear at 8 P.M. spoke the ship Marcia 22 bells saw this season to George Washington 3 whales & Inds

Friday 29th

First part light breeze from the South and quite clear mid is latter thick left off passing N.E. & Inds

Lat about 48.50
Long 151.53

Saturday 30th

First part light breeze from the South lighted up saw the land during 1 P.M. mid light air latter part calm and thick fog & Inds

Sunday 31st

First part calm and thick fog mid the same latter part light breeze from the S.W. and quite clear during 1 P.M. saw one finback & Inds
