

Remarks On Board Ship Columbus

Thursday Sept 11th 1835

First part Strong breeze from the Eastward and fine weather at 3 P.M. Threw a whale and he ran bad held on to him till 9 o'clock before he turned up at 11 took him to the ship and sent the watch. Latter calm at 8 commenced cutting 3 Ind cutting and Boiling one ship in site

Friday 12th

First part Light air from the South and fine weather at 5 P.M. got through cutting mid is Latter Strong breeze and rugged down both of ice to Ind

Saturday 13th

First part Strong gale from the South and rugged employed in Boiling mid is Latter part more moderate employed in Boiling and Rowing to Ind

Sunday 14th

First part Fresh breeze and rugged got through Rowing both of ice mid is Latter moderate and thick employed in Boiling two ship in site to Ind

Monday 15th

First part Fresh breeze and rugged at 3 P.M. took the ship Lydia of Fairhaven with this season mid is Latter Fresh gale from the South and rugged employed in Boiling and Rowing one ship in site. Lat 52.52

Tuesday 16th

First part Strong gale from the South and rugged at 2 P.M. got through Boiling at dark got through Rowing both of ice mid is Latter Strong gale from the S.W. and rugged one ship in site to Ind. Lat 52.40 Long 133.00

Wednesday Sept 17th 1835

First part Strong gale and rugged ship under short sail mid is Latter part more moderate commenced Rowing down one ship in site to Ind

Thursday 18th

First part moderate gale from the S.W. and clear spoke the ship Omega of New Bedford at 5 got through Rowing both of ice mid is Latter fresh breeze from the South and fine weather Rowing to the Eastward employed in scraping down to Ind Lat 52.32 Long

Friday 19th

First part Fresh breeze from the South and rugged at 2 P.M. spoke the North Light of Fairhaven cutting 3 whales this season at 4 P.M. Rowed and Threw a whale and Lat 52.30 mid is Latter gale and rain Latter more moderate saw Blunt of Fairbanks to Ind Lat 52.30 Long 133.

Saturday 20th

First part fresh breeze and rugged at 3 P.M. saw and heard back and killed a whale at 5.30 took him to the ship and took in sail mid moderate Latter Strong gale and rain at daylight commenced cutting blowing heavy lost the head and one lip and a piece of the Trawl to Ind Blowing and raining three ship in site

Sunday 21st

First part Strong gale from the South and fresh rain ship under coast reef main top sail mid is Latter more moderate started the works 3 ship in site to Ind No Ob
