Saturday June 11
These 24 hours strong gales from the N. E. W. at 8 A.M. wore ship set reef topsail at 10 A.M. more moderate at 12 noon reefed topsail at 12 turned reef out topsail for a ship of better weather bore steering same course that we are to end this day

Sunday June 12
These 24 hours strong gale with squalls from the N. E. W. at 4 A.M. set single reef topsail at 7 A.M. sails loose N. E. W. at 8 A.M. took in foreboard port. Stormed our air to drench the deck put up two ladders on the foreboard for rigging in case the channel captured as it is very poor & not seaworthy the Capt thinks to end the day

These 24 hours fine breezes from the N. E. W. at 4 A.M. fine weather with all sail on the ship what aint in the ship leaking to go to the water for hour when there is much sea and it is heavy very fine & pleasant day with light winds N. E. W. at 8 A.M. to end the day
