com with cloudy weather and blowing a fresh breeze from the S.W. B.R. under 2 Double Reef Topsails heading S.E. Have seen one sail to day. Have seen nothing that looks like land yet. Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty. At sun set more ship heading S.W.

Fri Jan 6th com with very weather with a fresh breeze from the S.W. B.R. under short sail have been on different tracks. The last 24 hours working to the Eastward. Have seen nothing that looks like land yet. Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty. Have been employed in making S.W. to day

Sat Jan 7th com with heavy weather with a fresh breeze from the S.W. B.R. under short sail on different tracks the last 24 hours. working to the Eastward. Have seen no land yet. Have been employed in making S.W. of sea. The main stay with Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty. One sail in sight a Merchantman

Sun Jan 8th com with nice weather with a fine breeze from the S.W. B.R. under 2 whole Topsails heading S.W. Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty. The B.R. Leak Remains the same

Mon Jan 9th com with heavy weather with a fine breeze from the S.W. B.R. under whole Topsails heading S.W. Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty. Have seen one sail to day a Merchantman

Tues Jan 10th Last Night heading S.W. at 8 AM you ship heading S.W. To day it is thick weather with a fine breeze from the S.W. B.R. under whole Topsails. To day broke out fresh water

Wed Jan 11th 1882
com with thick weather with a fine breeze from the S.W. B.R. under all sail heading S.W. The S.W. B.R. broke out the Lumber Rack in hopes to find a Carib. But did not find one. I will go down and look in the forepeak to get rid of the water. Permit Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty. The Ohio Leaks about the same

Thurs Jan 12th com with heavy weather with a fine breeze from the S.W. B.R. under all sail course S.W. at 1 PM spoke the schooner W.M. Crozier of Provincetown and named with her

Fri Jan 13th com with heavy weather with a fresh breeze from the S.W. B.R. under all sail. At daylight raised the Island of Saint Antonio. stood within 10 miles of it then kept off and went to the Leeward of it at sun set distant 12 miles. Barring off Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty

Sat Jan 14th
com with heavy weather with a light breeze from the S.W. B.R. under all sail heading S.W. a long through the night a fresh breeze until 3 AM. heading S.W. at 1 PM raised the Island of Sago at sun set. Barring W. 20 miles off. Have been employed to day in making spumpan. made a fine Barer for the Harbor. Boat caught one Porpoise. Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty

Sun Jan 15th com with heavy weather with a light breeze from the S.W. at 10 AM. Raised the Island of Saint Jago. Passed about 6 miles to the windward of it. Then shaped our course for the island of Maye. Raised the island of Maye at 3 PM. Put a piece of the Camp at dusk. So late would not go in to Anchor. Back in the light sails. Killed on the wind on the Starboard tack off shore at 2 PM. Took the Anchor off of the bow. Antonio Gorge still sick and off duty
