

Tuesday June 19th All this twenty four hours fine S E wind and fair weather headed to the Eastward so ends,

Wednesday 20th This day commence with fine breeze from Northward and fair weather headed E N E At 5 p m saw Cape Finesterre bears N E Dist 4 miles wore ship headed to the Westward Middle part the same Latter part steered S so ends.

Thursday 21st This day commence with strong breeze from Northward and fair weather steered S W At 7 1/2 p m short in sails and lay to headed to the westward at Midnight wore ship headed to the Eastward Latter part steered S W so ends.

Friday 22^d This day commence with strong breeze from Northward and fair weather steered S W At 6 p m steered W S W Middle part the same Latter part steered S W by W so ends.

Saturday 23^d All this twenty four hours fine breeze from N N W and good weather steered S W by W saw several finbacks so ends

Sunday 24th First part this day fine breeze from Northward and fair weather steered S S W at sun down short in sails Middle part headed to the Westward Latter part steered S so ends

Monday 25th All this day fine breeze from N E and fair weather steered several different courses still cruising so ends

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Tuesday June 26th All this twenty four hours fine N E wind and fair weather still cruising Employed in repairing the gafftop sails so ends

Wednesday 27th All this twenty four hours light breeze and fine weather repaired the mizen top stay sail still cruising so ends.

Thursday 28th All this twenty four hours light breeze and fine weather hands Employed in ship duty still cruising so ends.

Friday 29th First and Middle part this twenty four hours calm and light air Latter part light breeze from Northward still cruising so ends

Saturday 30th All this twenty four hours light breeze and fair weather still cruising hands Employed in ship duty so ends

Sunday July 1st All this twenty four hours light breeze from N E and fine weather headed to W W saw two Schooners and one Bark still cruising so ends.

Monday 2^d All this day light breeze and calm saw two whaling Scho. At 5 1/2 p m spoke E B Conwell still cruising so ends.

Tuesday 3^d All this twenty four hours light breeze from N N W and calm took one the boats from the top of the house and put her on starboard crains and put the other back on the house At 3 p m spoke Sch Fanny Byrnes and E B Conwell so ends
