

Sunday January 6th All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Northward and even squalls steered S keep Ignacio in view so ends

Monday 7th Commence with fine breeze from Westward and cloudy weather headed to the Southward At 4 p m wind hauled S E wore ship headed S by W At sun down reef the topsails Middle and Latter part strong breeze At 10 a m saw a white water to the windward of the vessel we call it sperm whales going quick to the windward At 11 a m it went out of sight take ship headed E look for the whales keep Ignacio scraping the iron works so ends.

Tuesday 8th Commence with strong breeze from S E and passing clouds headed E looking for the whales at 2 p m tack ship headed S W by S Through the night lay under of short sails Latter part wind hauled to the Northward headed to the Westward keep Ignacio scraping the iron works so ends

Wednesday 9th This day Commence with fine breeze from Northward and good weather steered W by N Through the night the same Latter part wind hauled N W and foggy weather keep Ignacio scraping the iron works so ends

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Thursday Jan 10th This day commence with fresh breeze from S and wet foggy At midnight cleared up set sails headed to the Westward Latter part the same Ignacio finish scraping the iron works at noon Capt gave him talking and send him foreward, painted the iron work black so ends.

Friday 11th Commence with light breeze from Southward and good weather steered S W by W Middle and Latter part steered S W hands Employed in ship duty so ends

Saturday 12th All this twenty four hours light breeze from N E and good weather steered S W hands Employed in ship duty so ends.

Sunday 13th This day commence with light breeze from N E and fine weather steered S E Middle part fine weather Latter part the same so ends.

Monday 14th This day commence with strong breeze from Northward and passing clouds steered S E At 3 p m keep her off S W Middle and Latter part the same hands Employed in ship duty so ends
