Friday May 2^d This day commence with calm St Paul rocks insight At 1 1/2 p m lowered the W boat down went fishing off the rocks at 8 p m boat returned with 1 1/2 bbl of fish Through the night weather the same Latter part fine breeze from N N W at noon rocks out of sight hands Employed in ship duty so ends Lat 1° 13' N Long 29° 00'

Saturday 3^d This day commence with light breeze from N and good weather headed N 8 by E at 2 p m wind hauled to N N E tack ship headed N W Middle and Latter part calm and rainy so ends no obs.

Sunday 4th Commence with calm and rain squalls. Through the night air from N N E steered N W by N Latter part fine breeze from N E and passing rain squalls so ends Lat 1° 41' N Long 29° 23'

Monday 5th This day commence with fine N E trades and passing squalls steered N W by N Middle and Latter part the same steered N W by N 1/2 N so ends Lat 2° 48' N Long 30° 48'

Tuesday May 6th This day commence with fine N E trades and fair weather steered N N W Middle part the same Latter part fresh trades steered N W so ends Lat 4° 33' N Long 32° 52'

Wednesday 7th This day commence with fine N E trades and fair weather steered N N W Bark under of all sails Middle and Latter part the same At 11 a m spoke a Austrian Bk leaking bad the Capt want to know if he could not keep company with us to Barbadoes Capt Benton told him yes so ends cook sick Lat 6° 09' N Long 34° 21'

Thursday 8th This day commence with fine N E trades and good weather steered N N W Middle and Latter part the same the Austrian Bark is insight so ends Lat 8° 44' N Long 36° 30'

Friday 9th All this twenty four hours fine N E trades and good weather steered N N W under of all sails the Austrian Bark insight so ends Lat 10° 32' N Long 38° 09'
