

Monday Jan 12th This day commence with fresh S.E. trades and cloudy weather still cruising under of short sails Middle and Latter part squally and rainy commence to stow down but it rain so much that we had to stop so ends no obs.

Tuesday 13th Commence with rainy weather at 3 p.m. stop raining we employed in stowing down at 5 p.m. finish stowing 22 bbls Middle and Latter part fresh trades and squally break out for meat & ship duty so ends
Lat 17° 44' Long 35° 26'

Wednesday 14th Commence with fresh breeze from Eastward and cloudy weather steered N.W. 1/4 W at sun down luff to headed to the Northward through the night wind more moderate Latter part squally and rainy Bark under of short sails no obs so ends

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Thursday Jan 15th Commence with squally and rainy weather Bark under of short sails headed to N.W. at 2 p.m. stop raining Middle and Latter part rainy and squally so ends no obs.

Friday 16th This day commence with wind from Northward with rain and squally weather Bark under of short sails headed to the N.W. at 6 p.m. wore ship headed to the Eastward Middle part squally Latter part set all the sails repaired some oil casks found the heads rotten so ends
Lat 18° 15' S Long 35° 18'

Saturday 17th This day commence with fine breeze from Northward and passing clouds steered S.W. Bark under of all sails at 2 1/2 p.m. wore ship headed N.W. by W at sun down short in sails Latter part weather the same Employed in re-mending the S Boat and repaired the foresail so ends
Lat 18° 17' Long 36° 11'

Sunday 18th All this twenty four hours fine breeze from Northward and passing clouds still cruising at sun down short in sails headed to the Eastward through the night the same Latter part wore ship headed W.N.W. so ends
Lat 18° 21' S Long 36° 47'
