

Ship Omega running across the Indian

Remarks Friday 9th 1847

first part of these 24 hours moderate breeze from the S. East and rainy squally weather Steering & heading South East

Middle part doubled reefed the top sails at daylight more favourable made all sail wind West Steering Sails out

Latter part light air and baffling winds discovered air fore yard to be springing or rather was springing last voyage and patched up but has more given out at the ends

Lat 40° 5' 16" 20 East

Remarks Saturday 10th 1847

first part of these 24 hours light air from South West Course South East by East at daylight all appearance of a bar then at daylight took in light Sails and doubled reefed

Middle part a heavy gale from the South laying too under a course reef. main top sail heading East by East turned it and every thing came at daylight heading South East light off. took in the fore sail Latter part strong gales and squally all prudent sail out and the Omega dragging her stern after her

Lat 39° 25' Long 17° 10'

Remarks Sunday 11th 1847

first part of these 24 hours strong gale from South West Course East under all prudent sail a heavy sea running and terrible squalls

Middle part much the same and the water coming on board the Omega in all shoves

Latter part much the same Course East South East all prudent sail out

Lat 38° 38' Long 20° 22' East

Month of April bound to the Pacific on a whaling voyage

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Remarks Saturday 24th 1847

first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from S. West Course South East all prudent sail out at 10 PM made all sail Course South East

Middle part fine at 2 PM came on squalls from S. West doubled reefed fore and aft and furled the main sail at daylight Steering to E. made all prudent sail

Latter part inclining a steady breeze made all sail Course S. East S. by East

Cake Opened

Lat 43° 25' Long 51° 15' East

Remarks Monday 25th 1847 Sunday

first part of these 24 hours moderate breeze from S. West Course South East by East Steering Sails out the weather looks more mild than has this week

Middle part wind hauled to the westward and very squally and a heavy sea and the Omega heaving before it. At daylight wind hauled again to the West Steering strong

Latter part much the same took in the fore top mast Stowing sail main top gallant sail and doubled reefed the fore top sail S. East all hands keeping the ballast

Remarks Tuesday 26th 1847 Monday

first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from S. West and no squalls took the reefs out and made all sail at 3 PM. Let the fore top mast Steering sail down and fished a quantity of Gulf weed or rather rock weed

Middle part very squally wind inclining aft at daylight took in fore top mast Steering sail for a squall abating

Latter part very squally all prudent sail out employed in getting up provisions and the after part S. East very squally wind about South West Course S. East by East Lat 43° 40' South Long 59° 40' East
