Middle part wind shifted to the N. East and blew a gale from the N. East under a close reef main top sail at daylight wind shifted to the North at the fore sail and top sail

Latter part wind shifted to the Westward squared the yards and made sail steering East

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Remarks Saturday 22

commenced with strong gales from the Westward Course East under double reefs at 4 P.M. weather moderate at a single reef main top sail and main top fore sail.

Middle part fresh breeze with frequent sail out

Latter part much the same with frequent sail out employed in getting out water and Bread at sunset cabin

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Remarks Sunday 23

commenced with strong breeze from the South west course East of the all sail out at 5 P.M. and hauled to the Westward at the steering sails two and a half

Middle part fresh breeze Course East

Latter part fine pleasant weather all sail out a sharp look out from mast and bow all in view employed keeping the Sabbath to Ends

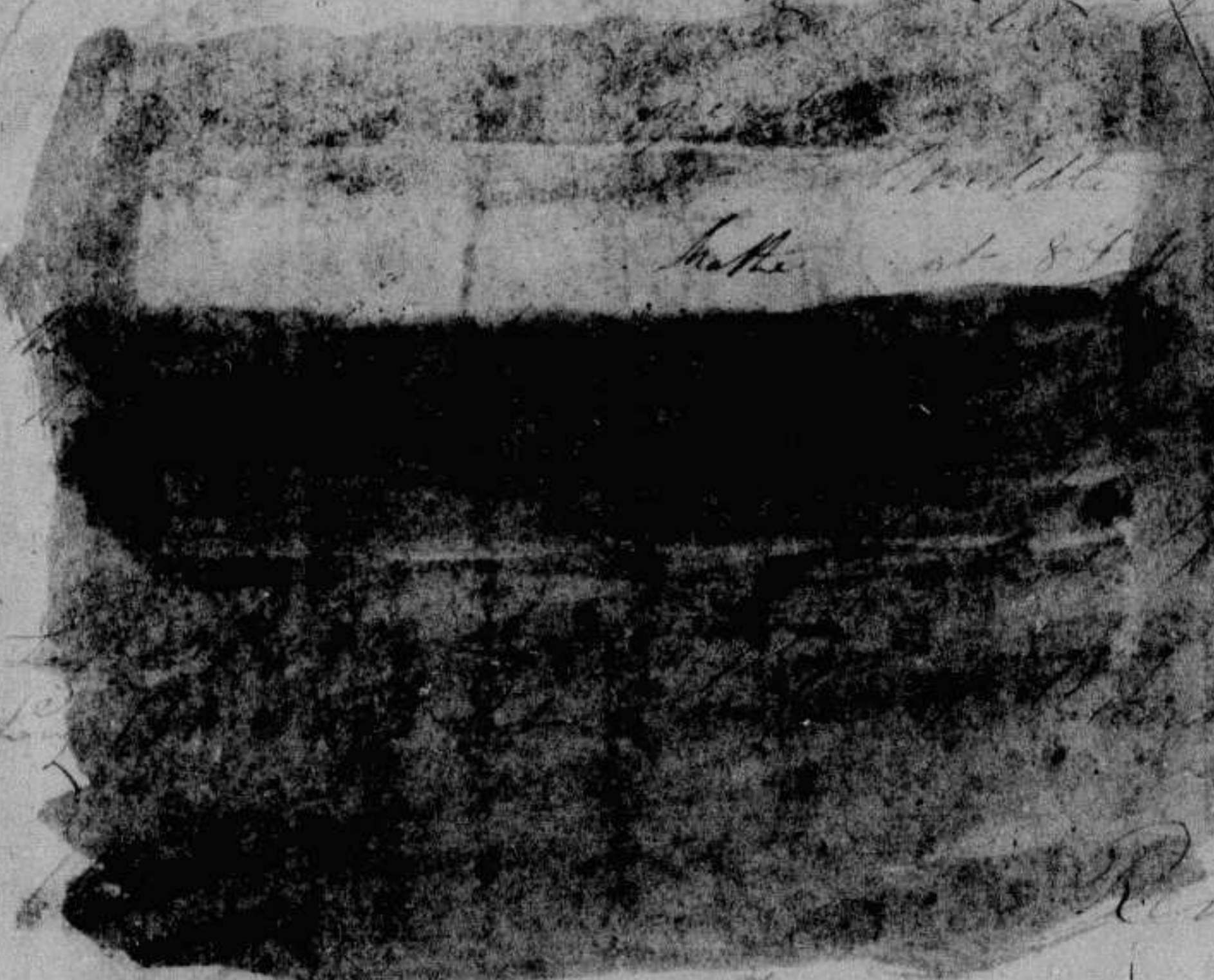
Middle part wind shifted to South East blowing a gale and hail squalls in a hurricane

Middle part strong breeze from the South East at 8 P.M. in the rigging one trained Breeze was taken with a set powdered black cloth changes came by the land back the present sail out the steering sail two and a half down the

Remarks Wednesday 26

first part of these 24 hours moderate breeze from South steering sharp by heading E by N at 4 P.M. heading East of South

Middle part strong breeze from the South steering by the land heading East of South at daylight strong breeze

Latter part wind increasing double reef top sail and aft employed getting up water and the fore hold to Ends nothing in sight and no prospect of a sight of land
