first part of these 24 hours gentle breeze and fine pleasant weather wind from the Westward Steering by at sunset the land just in sight took in all sail save a double reef main top sail and loose stick heading South

Middle part light baffling wind heading South Steaming boats near beach

at daylight made all sail employed putting down sails Cabin windows so dark and in the upper works

first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the South heading to the South and East under double reef at 4 P.M. took in the fore top sail and fore sail and close reefed the main top sail

Middle part strong breeze heading to the South

at 4 P.M. part and rather heading East to East that the fore and main top sail and fore sail the boats thick rising cloudy weather

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June Remarks Friday 5th

first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the South accompanied with rain heading East to East under double reef at 10 P.M. took in the fore top sail and fore sail at daylight very foggy course S East by East all sail out

at daylight very foggy and light baffling wind from the Westward Steering by at sunset the land just in sight took in all sail save a double reef main top sail and loose stick heading South

Lat 46° 11' Long 177° 30'

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Remarks Saturday 6th

at 4 P.M. part and rather heading East to East that the fore and main top sail and fore sail the boats thick rising cloudy weather
