July Sarah Anna Remarks Wednesday 14th 1863

first part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the East we steering in around Pitt Island at 6 P.M. another day has dreamt me too off from my bag and sent two boats ashore to a close and we are for recruits at 5 P.M. came off loaded with potatoes nearer to our eternal Cottage. Turnips and beet it being now very thick home what we have raising dirty weather left off boat boat to clean the land left undone to day for the night George Downs ~~to~~

will be forever ended for tomorrow will Middle part very squally in steering off bring its cares and then at daylight made all sail and stood in to the labors let us then voyage harbor Chatham Island at 11 A.M. came improve each hour in four fathoms water with the best bow and pulled as it passes over sail to Ende employed in washing the ship outside lives are short at the longest we know



Remarks Thursday 15th 1863

not that we may first part of these 24 hours gentle breezes from live to see another the East employed in washing at 3 P.M. took an anchor day how important and stand in under the South boat and it is for us to look anchored A B C D E F G H I J K well to ourselves

Remarks Friday 16th

being none of us first part of these 24 hours gentle breezes think as much from the South East employed in filling water as we ought of our on shore future state we are all hasten to the

Tomb a few more Middle part thick raising nasty weather days and we shall be numbered with it daylight sent 2 boats on shore for the dead let us then water at noon came off with 30 boats each strive for to do better to Ende thick dirty weather to Ende that we may die happy and gain heaven at last

July Remarks Sunday 17th 1863

first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the East employed in steering away water at 4 P.M. sent 2 boats on shore for water with a raft

Middle part calm

Later part employed on shore in filling water and on board in cleaning the ship for paint to Ende the wind from the East

Remarks Monday 18th 1863

first part of these 24 hours light and from the East at 2 P.M. came off with 15 each of water at sunset finished steering away water and cleared the decks

Middle part fine and the same

Later part sent all hands on shore in liberty land from the East and fine weather to Ende

Remarks Monday 19th 1863

first part of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the East all hands partly much on shore in liberty at sunset all came off

Middle part fine

at daylight strong breezes from the East sent 3 boats on shore for the raft came off without it could not raft it in account of of the tide at 10 A.M. sent 1 boat for luggs to men come off with 13 Hagg
