 July Remarks Tuesday 20th 1847

first part of this 24 hours strong breeze from the East at 2 P.M. sent 8 boats on shore for water at 4 P.M. came off with 30 cask at sunset finished stowing them in

Middle part fine pleasant weather

Later part sent the Subward Watch on shore on liberty employed on board stowing away water at seven finished stowing 150 bbls this day took on board a quantity of potatoes and Apples &c. sent them 24 hours on watch on shore on liberty

Remarks Wednesday 21st 1847

first part of this 24 hours gentle breeze from the East one watch on liberty on shore at 3 P.M. sent a couple of Cask on shore for water at sunset the liberty men returned on board

Middle part light air from the East

Later part fine pleasant weather sent the Starboard Watch on shore on liberty men one named Sergeant the water Clerk deserted having previous taken all their water on shore

Remarks Thursday 22nd

first part of this 24 hours gentle breeze from the North at 4 P.M. the boats of the Starboard caught and brought on board the 2 men that deserted employed in taking on board recruits and painting Ship at sunset liberty men all came off

Middle part wind shifted suddenly to the North and blew quite fresh

at 8 A.M. sent the boats on shore for water at 10 A.M. returned with the water and hoisted it in sent one watch on shore on liberty

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Ship Omega Tying at Wautonga Chatham Island all ready for
 July Remarks Friday 23rd

first part of this 24 hours strong breeze from the North one watch on shore on liberty at 4 P.M. let go the second Anchor at sunset liberty men returned to the Ship are now ready for sea but cannot get out

Middle part strong breeze from the North and very squally

Later part the Lane cannot get underway on account of the wind sent one watch on shore on liberty to land

Remarks Saturday 24th 1847

first part of this 24 hours strong breeze from the North and considerable swell we lay with both anchors ahead in 4 and half fathoms water waiting patiently for the wind to hold more favourable to get underway at 3 P.M. sent one boat on shore for potatoes returned landed at sunset the liberty men all came off

Middle part strong very strong gale to the South 10 fathoms now shown at 8 A.M. still strong on gale but a little abate in air we are now riding with both anchors ahead with 15 fathoms of chain fast on the fore-bower and 15 fathoms on the second Anchor we are now riding with our main-tackle fast to the mainmast and our fore up to the windward in 24 hours and no prospect of a shift of wind

Remarks Sunday 25th

first part of this 24 hours blowing strong from the North we are all ready for sea but cannot get underway both anchors ahead and no sign of a shift of wind

Middle part more moderate some appearance of a shift of wind at daylight more moderate but the wind still cannot get underway at 11 A.M. when sent one boat afishing to land
