

Ship. Oncoer lying at Masons Harbour with  
October 1847. Tuesday the 12<sup>th</sup>

first part of this 24 hours still and from the  
last we were in towards Masons bay at 3 P.M.  
Strong breeze from the Westward all appearance of a  
cloud at 4 P.M. came two in Masons Harbour in  
5 gettrains water and found this at Point Strong  
bay.

Middle part Strong breeze at daylight  
a strong gale from West & West. Co. by the same  
Anchors and looked the same till 10 till 12 till  
Cable and Masons Post went two boats in  
P.M. for west at noon boat returned that  
Cable two boats ahead of west could get it on  
land.

Wednesday the 13<sup>th</sup>

first part of this 24 hours following a hurricane  
from the West & West we lying at Masons  
Harbour with both Anchors ahead in 5 gettrains  
of water Bay bottom. cannot get it on  
land.

Middle part very severe in daylight  
in abundance and some thunder and lightning in this  
is low Zealand a ship in front of the Harbour  
what could we do outside of the Harbour at daylight  
strong gale at 10 A.M. 2 boats returned in P.M. to  
at land at noon boat returned. Squalls comes  
something heavier Gale is now from South West.

Thursday the 14<sup>th</sup>

first part of this 24 hours the same kind  
of wind and lying at Masons bay with both  
anchors ahead and the weather looks as it would blow  
for the next 3 days to come.

Middle part thunder and lightning and  
any quantity of hail.

Latter part the same. Old fashioned hail the  
West from West & West. Co. Ends this day  
it is Chyren cannot get to sea nor get effect  
of landing.

both Anchors ahead in a hurricane from W. S. W.  
October 1847. Friday the 15<sup>th</sup>

first part of this 24 hours the same  
for the last a strong gale from West & West we  
lying at Masons Harbour with both Anchors ahead  
and in all probability it will blow for the next 3 months  
to come.

Middle part wind the same at daylight and  
thunder to S. West. hail squalls are numerous

Latter part the same cannot expect a landing as  
yet for the ship.

Saturday the 16<sup>th</sup>

first part of this 24 hours Strong very heavy  
from West South West. we riding with both Anchors  
ahead and looked to the main West the moon quarters  
to see what we get no sign of a hill at sunset  
experienced a very heavy hail squall.

Middle part Strong very heavy accompanie  
with thunder and lightning.

Latter part the same the moon quarters this 24 hours  
but still no sign of a hill experienced some very  
heavy hail squalls.

Sunday the 17<sup>th</sup>

first part tremendous squalls of hail from  
the Westward we still riding with both Anchors ahead

Middle part the same

Latter part do do Ends employes keeping the  
Sabbath day.
