Wednesday the 29

First part of the 24 hours blowing a gale from the South West we lay to under a close reef Main top Sail to the Westward at 5 P.M. we spoke the Ship the Barclay Man 40 miles from here

Middle part calm calm

at daylight we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East nothing of West kind

Thursday the 30

First part of the 24 hours from the West all Sail up steering South at 8 P.M. both in light & breeze increasing at 5 P.M. in all Sail we were off from the West at daylight we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East nothing of West kind

Middle part blowing strong at daylight we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East

Latter part blowing strong at daylight we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East

Friday the 31

First part of the 24 hours blowing a gale from the South West we lay to under a close reef Main top Sail to the Westward at 3 P.M. moderating set double reef

Middle part blowing strong at 8 A.M. we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East

Lat 41° 46'  
Long 168° 42'

Latter part the same no signs of the gale abating to East

Round South and contrary winds prevail

Saturday the 1<sup>st</sup> 1848

First part of the 24 hours blowing a gale from the South West we lay to under a close reef Main top Sail to the Westward at 7 P.M. we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East at daylight we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East

Middle part gale abating at daylight set double reef

Lat 41° 35'

Latter part light baffling winds to Sea abating fast at noon made all Sail we were off from the West at daylight we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East

Sunday the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1848

First part of the 24 hours light baffling winds from the South West at 8 P.M. we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East at daylight we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East

Middle part thick rainy nasty weather at daylight we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East

Latter part heavy strong but clear we the above Ship to leeward & made all Sail steering South East

Monday the 3<sup>rd</sup> 1848

First part of the 24 hours heavy strong from the South West we lay to under a close reef Main top Sail to the Westward at 3 P.M. moderating set double reef

Middle part gentle breeze at daylight made all Sail steering South East

Lat 42° 15'  
Long 169° 50'

Latter part the same to East at noon calm
