

On the West Side of New Zealand Jan. 1848

Tuesday the 4th 1848

First part of the 24 hours light baffling
breeze from the South West at 3 P.M. and
hauling to the South and gentle breeze all
out Course South

Middle part Squally with rain the rain
to the South East Course South S. West
at daylight showing strong from the North East

Later part at 10 A.M. wind hauled to
the South West showing strong. Shortened sail and
have the ship tea at noon the same

Wednesday the 5th 1848

First part of the 24 hours showing strong
from the South East under a close reef main top
sail heading to the South West at 3 P.M. and
hauling to the South West and clear made sail
heading South East at 5 P.M. saw the land at
sunset more than 10 to the South West and shortened
sail for the night moderating
Middle part showing strong at daylight
at about noon and hauled ship heading
South East at 10 A.M. saw the land very
high and covered with snow

Thursday the 6th 1848

First part of the 24 hours strong breeze
from the South West we heading to the South East
in the land at 1 P.M. were off heading
South West at sunset shortened sail

Middle part light baffling breeze
at daylight ~~ship~~ made all sail

Later part the same saw black fish
covered 5 boats but saw nothing of them
after

Boys' Boat towards Stewart Island Jan 1848

January 1848

Thursday 13th 1848

First part of the 24 hours showing a heavy
gale from the South West we heading to the South
West at sunset more moderate

Middle part and from the same gale the South West
at daylight moderating made all sail steering by the
compass

Later part fine weather employed variously
fishing & rigging and other jobs

Friday 14th 1848

First part of the 24 hours moderate breeze
from the South East steering by the South West
under all sail

Middle part moderate at daylight made
all sail at 6 A.M. saw black fish covered
5 boats and took 11 to the ship

Later part calm employed killing black fish
and taking them on board

Saturday 15th 1848

First part of the 24 hours light baffling
breeze from the South we steering by the South West
under all sail

Middle part calm at daylight the same
commenced hauling out black fish at noon finished

Later part employed variously gentle breeze from
the North East Course South by East all sail
and employed repairing the fly Dick
