177 1/2 S. Light made all Sails steering by the
Phong breeze and a heavy Squall So Ends

Thursday the 6th 1848

First part of the 24 hours strong breeze from the South
and very Squally. All Sails set. Course N. by West.
Middle part much the same
latter part. Crossed S. West and a piece of it all Sails set.
we then turned at. Lat 40-50 South Long 177-18 West.
